

students but Hahn is thrilled to report a 98 per cent credit completion rate.

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"It is tough to have teachers 'on' for 225 synchronous minutes a day, but we've provided teachers with the flexibility to be creative and adapt to our model and that's been a positive move. . . students are engaged and they're managing and teachers have still been able to build strong relationships," said Hahn.

Unfortunately, one aspect that will not be dealt with any time soon is the loss of extracurricular activities and sports.

"Our saying here is 'don't let your guard down . . . And because of that, we're not even going to be considering these things at this time," said Hahn. "We know it's a big loss for our kids and their families, but health and safety is so much more important."

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
