Four LCVI students who tested positive for COVID-19 were never in class, school says

Students tested postive during extended break and did not enter the building, notice to parents reads

Kawartha Lakes This Week Tuesday, January 26, 2021

Four Lindsay high school students who tested positive for COVID-19 have not been inside the school since class resumed after an extended holiday break, a statement to parents reads.

Four positive cases for LCVI students were reported on the province's COVID tracker on Tuesday morning (Jan. 26), along with one positive case for a student who

attends Rolling Hills Public School in Bethany.

None of the cases were reported on the Trillium-Lakelands District School Board website on Tuesday, which states COVID-19 cases in schools will be updated each week day.

A statement to parents late Tuesday evening, signed LCVI administration, notified parents the high school students have not been in the building since testing positive.

"These cases are considered community-based transmissions, not school-based transmission. The individuals were identified as positive during the school shutdown period and have not been in the school building. The Public Health Unit will communicate with any individuals considered close or at risk contacts. The school is open."
