How many confirmed COVID-19 cases are there in Peterborough and Kawartha Lakes?

Editor's note: This article will be updated daily as more information becomes available. \* The health unit is now only updating numbers on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays.

In Kawartha Lakes on August 30 there was 1 new case reported, bringing the total of confirmed cases to 1,229 and 58 deaths (including 13 probable deaths), according to the local health unit. A total of 457 people have tested positive for a COVID-19 variant. A total of 1,175 cases are considered resolved. There are currently 9 active cases in Kawartha Lakes, and 1 active outbreak. Currently there are 0 cases at Ross Memorial Hospital with COVID-19.

#### Active: 23

In **Peterborough**, the local health unit has confirmed **12 new cases** bringing the **total of confirmed cases** to **1,687** as of **August 30, 2021**. There are **1,642** cases that are considered resolved and **23** active cases. There has also been **890 cases of variant of concern** discovered. There are **54** identified close contacts of cases. In addition, there is **no** outbreak in the region. A total of **22** people have died as a result of the virus.

# For Kawartha Lakes

The first two cases of COVID-19 involve people who had recently travelled. Three cases were reported by the health unit on Friday, March 20 and involve three residents at Pinecrest Nursing Home in Bobcaygeon. Two of the patients are self-isolating, while the three nursing home patients have been isolated, according to the

health unit.

On March 22, the health unit confirmed a man in his 80s died of COVID-19. He had no known contact with anyone with COVID-19 and had not recently travelled. The health unit reported on March 24 that a woman in her 40s is self-isolating after testing positive.

On March 25, the health unit's website listed 13 more cases than the day before.

The new cases include two female patients, in their 60s and 80s respectively, who have been hospitalized at Ross Memorial Hospital. Another case involves a man in his 70s who is self-isolating. The other 10 cases include three women in their 60s, three women in their 50s, two women in their 40s and two women in their 30s. The status of their cases was listed as pending.

The health unit reported a single new case on March 26.

Six more cases were reported on March 27.

On March 30, the health unit released there are now 33 cases of COVID-19 and 11 deaths, 9 of which were residents at Pinecrest Nursing Home. One other death was related to one of the residents. Of the 33 cases, the health unit says 27 cases are related to the outbreak at Pinecrest.

The health unit reported 8 more cases on March 31, bringing the total to 41. The total number of deaths do not include three more deaths at Pinecrest Nursing Home, which have not been reported by the local health unit. The data is not reported in real time.

The HKPR health unit announced seven more cases on April 1. Two more deaths of residents of Pinecrest Nursing Home were also confirmed.

As of April 4, 54 cases of COVID-19 were confirmed in the City of Kawartha Lake and three people were in hospital.

On April 6 the health unit reported a total of **82** cases in Kawartha Lakes and noted the spike in cases is linked to a changed provincial directive that requires all staff and residents in long-term care homes with the virus to be tested.

Two more cases were confirmed on April 7, as well as five additional deaths. **25** deaths are now confirmed by the health unit related to Pinecrest Nursing Home.

Several more cases were reported on April 9, bringing the total to 93. The health

unit says 28 deaths are related to Pinecrest.

On April 10, one more death was reported, as well as the 94th case.

11 new cases were reported on April 11.

3 cases were reported on April 12.

No cases were reported on April 13.

A single case was reported on April 14.

No new cases were reported on April 15, 16 or 17.

Although the numbers on the Health Unit's website were unchanged the afternoon of April 18, a representative from Ross Memorial Hospital confirmed that a patient from their continuing care wing had tested positive for COVID-19.

On April 19, two more cases were reported by the health unit, including the patient from Ross Memorial Hospital who tested positive the day before.

A further three cases were reported on April 20.

No cases were reported on April 21.

Three cases were reported on April 22.

No cases were reported on April 23. A death previously reported in long-term care was also removed as it was deemed not related to COVID-19.

Four cases were reported on April 25.

May 1, the Health Unit confirmed one additional case in Kawartha Lakes, one additional hospitalization and five more cases considered resolved.

No new cases were reported May 2, but one additional case was confirmed resolved.

A single case was reported on May 3.

Five cases previously reported as positive were removed on May 5 due to a testing error.

Four more cases were removed on May 6 due to a testing error.

Two positive cases were announced on May 7.

One additional case was reported May 10.

No cases were reported on May 11.

There were 2 cases reported on May 12.

No cases were reported on May 13, although the health unit reported four probable cases.

A single case was reported on May 14.

One additional case was confirmed May 16, bringing the total to 142.

On May 21, there were 145 confirmed cases along with two probable cases and 29 high-risk contacts.

On May 22, there were 147 confirmed cases along with 7 probable cases. The health unit reports there are now 40 high risk contacts associated with the cases.

On May 24, there were 148 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in the City of Kawartha Lakes with 6 probable cases. There are 30 high risk contacts and 9 hospitalizations.120 cases are considered resolved. No new cases were reported on May 25. The official total was reduced by one to 147.

No new cases were reported on May 26. The official total remains at 147, however there are 23 high risk contacts being investigated.

The count stayed at 147 for May 27 to May 30 as well.

On May 31, two new cases were reported in Kawartha Lakes bringing the total to 149. There are 10 high risk contacts identified and 9 hospitalizations have been reported. 124 cases have been resolved.

Two more cases were reported June 1, bringing the total to 151.

No cases were reported on June 2 and there are no current outbreaks.

On June 3 just one more case was declared.

On June 4 no more cases were announced.

On June 5, three new cases were reported bringing total to 155.

On June 7, there were 156 confirmed cases in the City of Kawartha Lakes with 24 current high risk contacts.

On June 8 there were 156 confirmed cases in the City of Kawartha Lakes with 25 current high risk contacts. One additional hospitalization was also reported.

No additional cases or hospitalizations were reported on June 9, June 10 or June 11.

Two new cases were reported on June 12 along with one outbreak at a long-term care home after a staff member at Pine Crest Nursing Home in Bobcaygeon tested positive.

No new cases were reported in Kawartha Lakes Jun 13 to June 17

On June 18 two cases were declared in Kawartha Lakes.

On June 19, no new cases were declared and there is currently only one outbreak at Fenelon Court Long Term Care in Fenelon.

On June 20, no new cases were reported. The outbreak at Fenelon Court Long Term Care continues.

One new cases was reported on June 21 bringing total to 161. The outbreak at Fenelon Court Long Term Care continues.

On June 22, one more case was reported.

On June 23, no additional cases were announced.

On June 24, two new cases were reported.

On June 25, one more was was declared.

While on June 26, no more cases were announced.

Cases reached 167 on June 28.

On June 29, one was was removed due to duplication of a case.

## **For Peterborough**

The first case was announced on March 15 involving a man who had travelled. A second case was announced on March 18 and involved a person who had close contact to the area's first case.

A third case was reported on March 19 and involved travel to Florida.

Two more cases were announced on March 24. One is a woman in her 70s who had recently returned from Florida. According to the health unit while returning home she attempted to get tested at a hospital but was unable due to the long line-up. She was tested at home by paramedics and five close contacts have been confirmed. The other confirmed case is a male in his 60s who attended an Edmonton bonspiel, and the health unit says it is working to track his close contacts.

The 6<sup>th</sup>case was confirmed on Wednesday, March 25. The health unit says an employee at a Bobcaygeon nursing home, where there is a outbreak of COVID-19, is confirmed to have the virus. The woman is 55 and lives in Peterborough and is in self-isolation at home. The 7<sup>th</sup>case was also confirmed on March 25 and is a 28-year-old male who is a close contact of a case from outside of Peterborough. He is also in self-isolation at home.

Public health announced two more cases on March 26. The most recent cases include a resident at St. Joseph's at Fleming, who is in her 90s and a woman in her 60s who has a travel history to the U.S. The woman has been hospitalized and is in self-isolation at PRHC.

Four more cases were announced on March 27.

Fifteen more cases were announced on March 30.

The total remained at 28 as of March 31, including four people in hospital and two of those in the ICU.

No new cases were reported by Peterborough Public Health on April 1.

On April 2, 13 cases were reported.

Two more cases were reported on April 4.

One case was reported on Sunday, April 5. As of that date, there are 737 confirmed negative cases and 182 cases still under investigation. To date, 963 people have been tested.

On April 6, no new cases were reported however there were 749 confirmed negative cases with 221 still under investigation. As of April 6, 1,014 people had been tested.

Peterborough Public Health was reporting four fewer cases of COVID-19, May 2 than the day before, presumably a result of false positives due to a laboratory error with tests reported last week, but no further information was immediately available.

One additional case was reported on Sunday, May 3. Forty seven cases have been resolved and three people have died.

On May 4, Peterborough Public Health reported 15 fewer cases of COVID-19 than the day before, as well as one fewer death after it was determined one person did not die as a result of COVID-19.

On May 5, the health unit announced one fewer case than the day before with 68 confirmed infections. There are 2,798 confirmed negative cases and 829 test results pending. Forty eight cases have been resolved.

The total number of confirmed cases shrunk again on May 6 to 67 after another case was removed due to a testing error.

Cases increased by 4 on May 7 to 71.

A single case was reported on May 8.

One additional case of COVID-19 was reported in Peterborough May 10, bringing the total to 73. The Health Unit also an additional three cases to be resolved.

So far, 6,950 people have been tested and there are currently six active cases. 69 cases have been

resolved.

COVID-19 cases in Peterborough city and county rose by two on May 22 to 79. So far, more than 7,000 people have been tested and there are currently 8 active cases. 69 cases have been resolved. One institutional outbreak continues at Kawartha Heights Retirement Living in Peterborough.

On May 24, Peterborough Public Health reported 81 confirmed positive cases with more than 7,150 individuals tested. Currently, there are 9 active cases and 70 resolved cases. One institutional outbreak continues at Kawartha Heights Retirement Living in Peterborough.

No new cases were reported on May 25.

Two new COVID-19 cases were reported on May 26 bringing the number of confirmed infections to 83. More than 7,300 people have been tested. Currently, there are 10 active cases and 71 resolved cases. The outbreak at Kawartha Heights Retirement Living in Peterborough is declared over.
