Articles of a Treaty

made and concluded on the Thirty-first day of October
in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred
and Twenty-three, between His Most Gracious Majesty,
George the Fifth, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain
and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of
India, by His Commissioners: Angus Seymour Williams, of
the City of Ottawa, in the Province of Ontario, Esquire,
Barrister-at-Law, and Departmental Solicitor of the
Department of Indian Affairs; Robert Victor Sinclair,
of the said City of Ottawa, Esquire, One of His Majesty's
Counsel, learned in the law, and Uriah McFadden, of the City
of Sault Sainte Marie, in the said Province, Esquire, one of
His Majesty's Counsel learned in the law; the said Angus
Seymour Williams, Chairman of the said Commission,
representing the Dominion of Canada, and the said
Robert Victor Sinclair and Uriah McFadden, representing
the Province of Ontario, of the One Part
and

the Members of the Chipewewa Tribe, inhabiting, as members
of Bands thereof, reserves at Christian Island, Georgina
Island and Rama, all in the Province of Ontario, by their
Chiefs and Headmen, of the Other Part.
