

A pair of GO buses have been temporarily retrofitted to serve as mobile COVID-19 vaccine clinics as part of the Province's efforts to target those who have yet to receive a first or second dose.

Since hitting the road in August, the buses have visited Canada's Wonderland, Rogers Centre, BMO Field, select shopping malls, various universities and colleges, farmers' markets, festivals and more to provide COVID-19 vaccines.

The GO-VAXX bus will be on the Lindsay Exhibition grounds on Sunday, Sept. 26 from 5 to 9 p.m., prior to the LEX's annual fair-closing demolition derby. Individuals must pay admission to the fairgrounds in order to access the bus.

"We're pleased to be working with the province and Metrolinx to bring the GO-VAXX bus to our communities," says health unit health promoter Doreen Boville. "We encourage anyone who still needs COVID-19 vaccine to get aboard the bus and get a first or second dose so they are fully protected against COVID-19, especially as we head into a fourth wave."

Anyone age 12 - or turning 12 this year - is eligible. No appointment is necessary.

Those wishing to take advantage of the GO-VAXX bus to receive a vaccine is reminded to:

- A health card – even one that is expired – or other form of government-issued photo identification such as a driver's license, passport, Status card or birth certificate, is required.
- Eat and drink something before arriving to prevent feeling faint or dizzy while being vaccinated.
