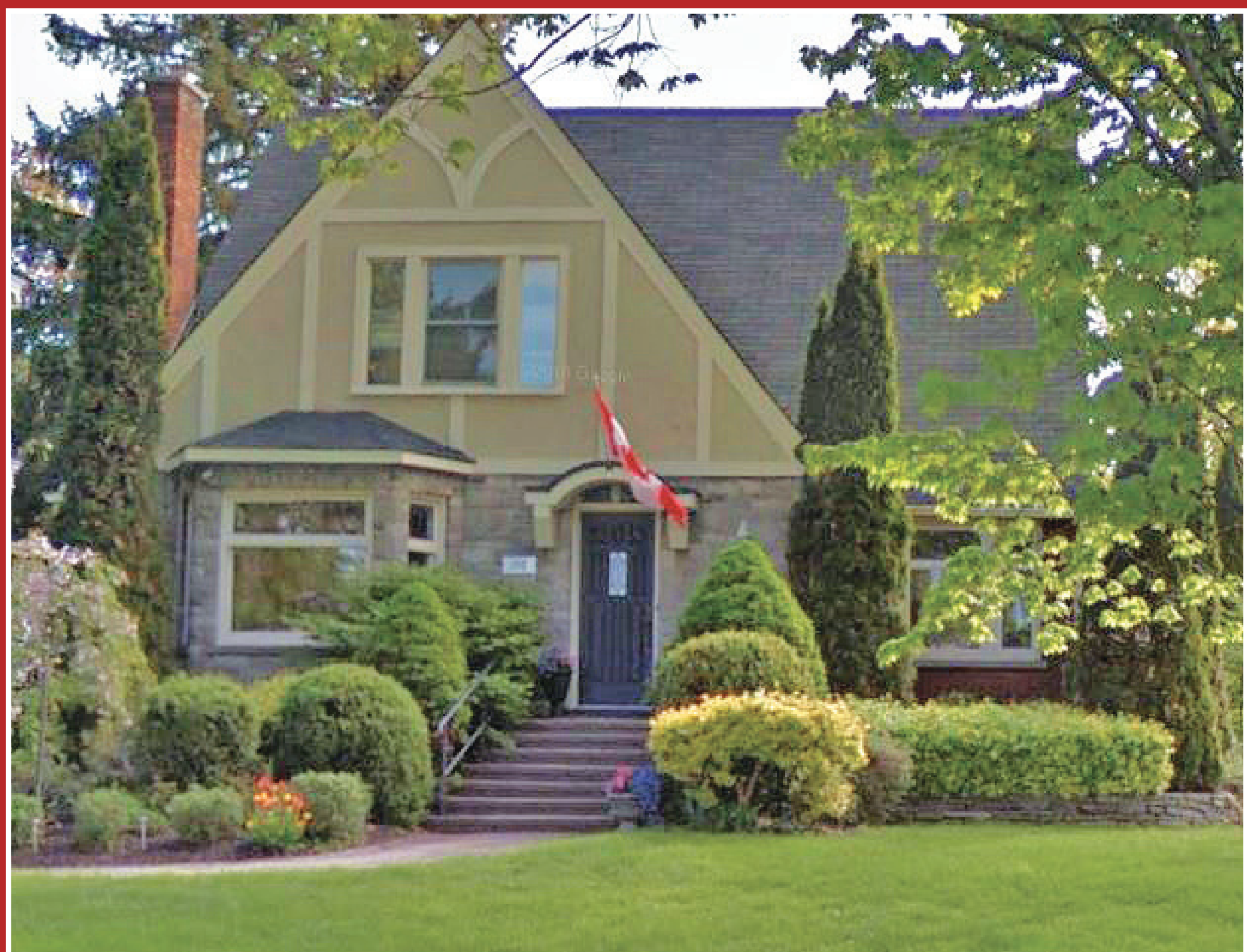


# COBOURG ARCHITECTURE **TIMELINE**

## **CHESTER TAYLOR HOUSE**

This home in the Tudor Revival style has the rare feature, for Cobourg, of timbering decorative details. It also possesses prominent cross gables and the use of both stone and brick. 198 Church St. 1950



## **DEPOT HOUSING**

Built on land previously occupied by the military depot, this was the first income-based housing development in Cobourg. Long townhouses were placed randomly giving a less structured appearance. D'Arcy St at Elgin St. East. 1953



## **ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION BRANCH 133**

This building includes a members' lounge, offices and a multi-use auditorium, but is slated for demolition shortly. It will be replaced by a large new building nearby which will house both the Legion and upscale condominiums. 136 Orr St. 1954
