
Outstanding Barnum House season



Barnum House Museum, Grafton, has had one of its best visiting years, curator Mrs. Gorman Young told the Sentinel-Star yesterday.

Over 3,000 visitors went through the fine old home during the season. The museum was open daily during July and August and on Sundays during May, June, September, October.

"And it's not over yet," said Mrs. Young, "we have a group of school children weekend." this

The Barnum House committee is planning its annual old-time Christmas party for December 12, this year, Mrs. Young said. Two times will be given for members to attend, from four to seven, and from eight to glown
