

Former Supreme Court judge heads Order of Canada roster

A former Supreme Court judge, a distinguished filmmaker and an Alberta Indian chief were among 74 Canadians appointed this week to the Order of Canada.

Former Supreme Court of Canada justice Jean Beetz, who retired last year, was appointed a companion of the order by Governor-General Jeanne Sauve.

Mr. Beetz, 62, sat on the nation's highest court for 14 years, and served as constitutional adviser to former prime minister Pierre Trudeau.

Filmmaker Donald Brittain was appointed an officer in recognition of "his masterful visual records of our social and cultural past," Mrs. Sauve's office said Wednesday.

Mr. Brittain is probably best known for his documentary, *The Champions*, which outlined the political struggles between Mr. Trudeau and former Quebec premier Rene Levesque.

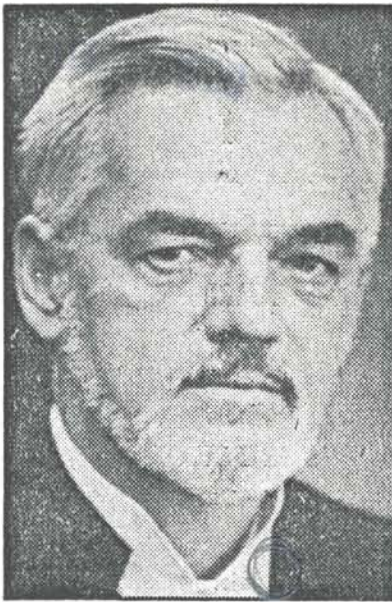
The order was established in 1967 to recognize outstanding achievement and service.

Mrs. Sauve also appointed as officers former veterans affairs minister George Hees, and former Commons clerk Charles Koester.

Lawyer Alan Eagleson and newspaper owner and businessman K. C. Irving of New Brunswick were also appointed officers.

Mr. Eagleson, director of the NHL Players' Association, is best known as the driving force behind the Canada Cup hockey series.
