

# The Cobourg Horse Show

It is now sixty-six years since the first Cobourg Horse Show was held in Horse Show Park and close to half a century since it ended. During its years, from 1905 until 1926, it grew to be one of the most exciting and certainly one of the most famous shows of its time, leaving behind when it was over, a nostalgia, a wistful yearning for a time when the horse was supreme and the world went a little slower.

It is easiest perhaps to start with a description of the 'old' Cobourg Horse Show years and its inception. Toward the end of the last century and well into this, wealthy American families began spending their summers in Cobourg. They arrived, many of them, in early spring and stayed until late fall; bought or built large homes and brought their own stables with them. The idea of a summer horse show was conceived by some of these summer people along with a few Cobourg residents. The date for the first show was set for Monday, August 14 and it was held in the empty fields on south D'Arcy Street — the site later known as Horse Show Park. Only twelve classes were offered, including a jumping, saddle and a visitors livery class open to horses hired for the season by Cobourg residents and visitors.

The show was a great success, much to the surprise of everyone, including the directors themselves. Encouraged by the enthusiasm of the first show, the directors decided to hold a larger show the following summer. And in 1906 it was expanded to three days, with 16 classes, 60 entries and a prize list of \$1,009 — triple the amount of the first year. That year a grandstand seating five or six hundred was filled each day and a mass of spectators crowded the ring; Wednesday afternoon was declared a holiday and when the show was over the Cobourg World, called it "the greatest event of its time ever held east of Toronto."



The Cobourg Horse Show had begun with such wild enthusiasm that the momentum seems to have carried it along as it grew in size, expertness and reputation. By 1908 over 6,000 turned out for a four day show and between 1908 and 1914 ten thousand spectators spilled over the grounds to watch what had now become a tradition in horse shows. The Rochester Ferry brought over a thousand visitors in one day and the Toronto trains needed 11 extra coaches to meet the demand. Box seats were customarily auctioned off at the old Arlington Hotel just before the show, but in later years, they were sold months in advance. In 1909 a new horse barn which could stable 65 horses was built in the park and the directors could proudly boast it had all the modern conveniences, including electricity and a telephone!

One of the reasons for the reputation of the show lay in the high caliber of horses and riders who competed each year. The Sifton Stables exhibited for the first time in 1910 and in 1914, Sir Henry Pellat of Toronto brought his stables to the show as did the Rogers and the Jarvis Stables and Crow and Murray of Toronto. Other favorites were Mrs. Lulu Long of New York, Charles Wilmot and Charlie Speer of Cobourg. In later years racing competitions were added — a hunt race each afternoon and a red coat race for private stakes held over a two mile course, and in 1912 an officers jumping class which was wildly popular with the crowds.

Although the races and jumping classes were the spectacular events drawing large crowds, some of the more serious judging was conducted in the agricultural and draught horse class. In a world that had yet to experience mass industrialization farming interests came too close to the bone to be ignored.

However, it was not only the crowds and the competition that made the show so unforgettable. 'Horse Show Week' as it was called, became for many a glittering, sometimes exhausting round of balls, garden parties, picnics and excursions. And for those who missed the gala balls, there were evening band concerts where it wasn't unusual to see hundreds of guests, women in gowns with hems that swept the grass, strolling under the trees in Horse Show Park.

The park itself has been described by those who were there as one of the most beautiful grounds. It's easy to picture

how it must have looked, with the old beech and walnut trees filling the site and the stands built under them so that the branches became a natural, cool canopy on summer afternoons. From the seats in the north end, one could look across the ring to the lake, where occasionally a sailing yacht from Detroit or Rochester lay at anchor.

In 1912 the Cobourg Horse Show came into international prominence when Confidence, a heavy jumper owned by the Hon. Clifford Sifton set a record high jump of 7' 10". A month later at the Central Canada Exhibition held in Ottawa Confidence jumped 8' 1/2" which has been acknowledged the world's high jump record for many years.

The year 1914, the last of the great years for the show, was a tense time for everyone. War in Europe seemed inevitable and during the spring and summer it was rumoured that the show would have to be cancelled. However, despite the fact that by the time the show started, war had been declared, over 600 entries were listed, box seats were all sold, and membership was up. In the paper, war briefs appeared side by side with show results and for the first time military uniforms were seen along with the red coated hunt.

The show was cancelled in 1915 and when it was revived after the war, there were predictions it would continue as before. But it was a very different sort of world when the show resumed in 1919. Industry, better transportation, automobiles and a world going crazy for mechanical gadgets ruled out a return to the age of the horse.

On a June evening in 1926, a number of Toronto horsemen, asked the directors for permission to hold a three day show. In July it was announced that a two day show would be held and on August 12 and 13 a small group of horsemen exhibited before a handful of spectators. The show could only be held in the evening after the now very popular polo matches. The Cobourg Horse Show years were over.

The Cobourg Horse Show years were over — but not forgotten. Wherever a few horsemen gathered together during the following years, talk would eventually turn to the 'old' Cobourg show and the possibility of holding it again. Then in 1969, a small number of Cobourg citizens made the first tentative motions toward reviving it. They approached Mr. Gordon Wright, of Wyvern Farms in Grafton to

assist in its revival (he became the show's president in both 1969 and 1970) and the Cobourg Chamber of Commerce eagerly agreed to become its sponsor.

The show was to be held in Horse Show Park, with two divisions, English and Western. And on September 28, 1969, the Cobourg Horse Show was reborn.

Over 5,000 attended the one day show and encouraged by the response from both the public and contestants, the directors immediately set about exploring the possibility of holding a larger show the following summer. Throughout the winter and spring of that year the directors met regularly to discuss and plan the show. It became an immense task, involving many people and imposing long hours of work and much responsibility. For the first time, the show's uniqueness in Eastern Ontario was defined by having three distinct divisions, Western, English and Arabian. Obviously a new site was necessary to contain such an enormous undertaking and in early spring the directors were delighted to learn that the Department of National Defence would offer the use of its 33 acre grounds at the Cobourg Armed Forces Base on north D'Arcy Street.

Both the Arabian and Western Divisions were to hold a one day show on Saturday 22; the English a two day show, a junior on Friday and a senior show on Saturday. Then on February 25 it was officially announced that the Canadian Equestrian Team would take part in the show in an Eastern Ontario Championship Grand Prix sponsored by Rothmans of Pall Mall, to be held on Sunday, August 23.

The Cobourg Horse Show was well on its way to recapturing its past glory and once again becoming a tradition among horse shows.

#### HISTORICAL NOTE

The Cobourg Horse Show Association has started to record historical items from the show years at the beginning of this Century, where the Cobourg Horse Show was called the Finest in America.

Some items, such as posters from 1909-1914, programs from 1920-21, ribbons, medallions struck in 1914 and pictures of early Polo Games etc. will be on display at this year's show and we wish to thank the owners for lending these relics for this purpose. We are hopeful to have a more complete display in 1972 and to feature a describing article in our 1972 program together with a reproduction of the exciting 1909 poster on the front cover. Trusting that our souvenir programs will become more and more a collectors item.

CLASS 5 - JUNIOR WORKING HUNTER PONY, over 13 hands and not exceeding 14.2 hands. To be shown over a course of jumps. Main consideration an even hunting pace, manners, way of going, style of jumping. Conformation not to count, but hunting soundness required. Ponies will jump a suitable course of fences at 3 feet.

CLASS 6 - JUNIOR HANDY WORKING HUNTER PONY, - over 13 hands and not exceeding 14.2 hands. To be shown over a course of jumps to test the horse's handiness and obedience. Main consideration an even hunting pace, manners, way of going, style of jumping. Conformation not considered but hunting soundness required.

CLASS 7 - BALTIMORE HILLS EQUESTRIAN CLUB OPEN PONY WORKING HUNTER STAKE. Under 14.2 hands. \$ 100.00 Stake. To be eligible for this class ponies must have entered and shown in one other class in this section. To be shown over a suitable course of jumps. To be judged on performance and hunting soundness. Conformation will not be considered. Those ponies not exceeding 13 hands will be shown over a course of jumps not to exceed 2'6". Those ponies over 13 hands, but not exceeding 14.2 hands will be shown over a course of jumps not to exceed 3 feet. Trophy awarded. 1st prize - 30%, 2nd-20%, 3rd-15%, 4th-10%, 5th-10%, 6th ribbon only.

**B. - JUNIOR WORKING HUNTER.** CHSA Rating "A". Jumps in this division not to exceed 3'6".

PRIZES: Trophy where indicated and 6 ribbons. \$ 25.00, 15.00; 10.00; 5.00 and 5.00. Classes 11 and 14 are exceptions, as indicated.

HORSES: The classes over jumps in this division will be divided in two sections: 1) over 14.2 hands but not exceeding 16 hands. 2) over 16 hands. Horses are required to be measured before entering the ring. The measuring will take place at a designated area adjacent to the hunter ring. All horses entering the show must be measured by 10.00 A.M.

To be shown over a course of jumps. Main consideration an even hunting pace, manners, way of going, style of jumping. Conformation not considered, but hunting soundness required.

CLASS 12 - JUNIOR WORKING HUNTER, 16 hands and over. To be shown over a course of jumps. Main consideration an even hunting pace, manners, way of going, style of jumping. Conformation not considered, but hunting soundness required. Trophy awarded.

CLASS 13 - JUNIOR HANDY WORKING HUNTER, 16 hands and over. To be shown over a course of jumps, to test the horse's handiness and obedience. Main consideration an even hunting pace, manners, way of going, style of jumping. Conformation not considered, but hunting soundness required. Trophy awarded.

CLASS 14 - JUNIOR HUNTER STAKE, 16 hands and over. \$ 200.00 Stake. 1st prize 30%, 2-20%; 3-15%; 4-10%; 5-5%; 6-5%. Trophy awarded and ribbons for first 6 places. To be shown over a course of jumps. Main consideration an even hunting pace, manners, way of going, style of jumping. Conformation not considered, but hunting soundness required.

**C. - JUNIOR JUMPERS.** CHSA Rating "A"

PRIZES: Trophy where indicated and 6 ribbons. \$30.00; 20.00; 15.00; 10.00; 5.00 and 6th ribbon only. Class 13 is an exception as indicated.

CLASS 15 - JUNIOR OPEN JUMPER, over 14.2 hands. Table A. Jumps will not exceed 3'6" in the original course. In case of a tie, jumps will be raised. Time is to be the deciding factor on a second jump off. Only those tied for first will jump off.

CLASS 16 - JUNIOR FAULT AND OUT, OVER 14.2 HANDS. Any errors mean elimination. Ticks, touches, not to count. Complete dislodgement of fence or rail, or refusals will be counted as faults. Winner will be on the greatest number of fences jumped in 45 seconds.

CLASS 22-CHSA MEDAL CLASS (Equitation over jumps). Open to Junior A members of the Canadian Horse Show Assoc. in good standing at the date of closing of entries having reached their 14th birthday but not their 18th on Jan. 1st of the current year. Non-members may join by adding their annual CHSA dues to the entry fees. Not less than 6 jumps at 3'6" over a figure eight course. Section 2 b and Section 5 Part III requirements. Judges must call for any two requirements from section 5, Part III.

CLASS 23-JUNIOR EQUITATION OVER JUMPS, open to all junior riders. Jumps will be up to 2'9" for ponies, 3'6" for horses.

CLASS 24- JUNIOR EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIP, open to all riders who have won first or second in classes 20, 21, 22 and 23. Jumps may be required.

#### G. - AMATEUR OWNER HUNTER DIVISION

ENTRIES in this AMATEUR OWNER HUNTER SECTION are to be ridden by AMATEUR OWNERS or members of their immediate family who are no longer eligible to compete as juniors. Leased horses are not eligible and multiple ownership is not permitted unless all owners are of the same immediate family. Judges are to select the horses apparently the most agreeable to hounds. CLASS 36-AMATEUR OWNER WORKING HUNTER STAKE, ANY WEIGHT. \$ 250.00. To be eligible, horses must have entered at least one other class in this section. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Hunting soundness required.

#### H. - OWNER JUMPER DIVISION as defined in Canadian Horse Show Association Rule Book.

FOR RIDERS who are no longer eligible to compete as junior exhibitors and who are owners or a member of the owner's immediate family. Riders may show in other divisions, but must not have shown in senior international in the past two years.

HORSE ELIGIBILITY: All horses are eligible to be shown in this division except horses which have been shown in the senior international in the past two years. Leased horses are not eligible and multiple ownership is not permitted, unless owners are members of the immediate family. Six wins in owner-jumper division - i.e. two first in owner-jumper division equals one first in green jumper division.

JUMP REQUIREMENTS: Maximum 4'4" high and 5'6" spread in first round. In case of jump-off, course should be shortened. Jumps may be raised and spread at the discretion of the course builder.

PRIZES: Trophy, where indicated and 6 ribbons. General Classes: \$ 30, \$ 20; \$ 15; \$ 10, \$10. Stake Classes: 30%; 20%; 15%; 10%; 5 %; 5 %.

CHAMPIONSHIPS: There will be a Champion and Reserve Champion Ribbon offered in the Owner Jumper Division.

CLASS 37-OWNER JUMPER, Table A. Time will be deciding the winner on the first jump-off, if faults are equal. Trophy awarded.

CLASS 38-OWNER JUMPER, F.E.I., Fault and Out.

Time allowed - 60 seconds. Ticks, touches NOT to count. Complete dislodgement of fence or rail, or refusals will be counted as faults.

CLASS 39-OWNER JUMPER STAKE \$ 250.00, Table A.

In case of a tie in the first round, jumps will be raised. Time to be the deciding factor on a second jump-off; only those tied for first will jump-off.





The only hackamore permissible is one with a rawhide braided or leather braided or rope bosal. No wire curbs or no chin strap narrower than one-half inch or no nose bands or tie-downs will be permitted. Trophy and six ribbons. \$ 30; 25; 20; 15; 10 and 5. A rider may use only one horse per reining class.
- CLASS 2-JUNIOR WESTERN PLEASURE CLASS. Open to junior competitors 16 years of age or under as of January 1st, 1971. No stallions allowed. Riders to be neatly dressed in suitable western show attire. Horses to be shown at a walk, jog and lope, on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Entries shall be penalized for being on wrong lead at a lope. Reins shall be held in one hand and cannot be changed during performance. When asked to reverse, horses must be turned to the centre of the ring. No reverse at a lope. Trophy and 6 ribbons. \$ 10; 8; 6; 4; 2.
- CLASS 3-TRAIL HORSE CLASS. Horses to be shown in serviceable western tack including rope and slicker only. Rider to be neatly dressed in suitable western show attire. Any humane type of bit or hackamore may be used. Horse to be shown at a walk, jog or lope on a reasonably loose rein, without undue restraint. Trophy and 6 ribbons. \$ 30; 25; 20; 15; 10.
- CLASS 4-JUNIOR HORSEMANSHIP CLASS SPONSORED BY MRS. J.A.COX, R.R.1, BALTIMORE, ONT. Open to Junior Competitors 16 years of age or under as of January 1st, 1971. No stallions allowed. Riders to be judged on seat, hands, appointments of horse and rider, and suitability of horse to rider and performance of horse. Horses to walk, jog and lope both ways of the ring. The judge may ask the rider to answer questions on tack, equitation and simple anatomy. Trophy and six ribbons. \$ 10; 8; 6; 4; 2.
- CLASS 5-OPEN WESTERN PLEASURE. Riders to be neatly dressed in suitable western show attire. Horses to be shown at a walk, jog and lope, on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Entries shall be penalized for being on wrong lead at a lope. Reins shall be held in one hand and cannot be changed during performance. When, asked to reverse, horses must be turned to the centre of the ring. Trophy and six ribbons. \$ 30; 25; 20; 15; 10.
- CLASS 6-SINGLE BARREL PICK-UP RACE. Running start, rider races to a barrel placed at far end of arena, circles barrel picking up second man and races to finish line. Both riders must be completely astride before crossing finish line. Second man can only jump for two horses during the race. Horses must enter and return between markers. Trophy and six ribbons. \$ 25; 20; 15; 10; 5.
- CLASS 7-OPEN BARREL RACE. Running start, horse makes right turn around right barrel, left turn around left barrel, left turn around head barrel and back between base barrels and markers to cross finish line. Or: Left around left barrel, right around right barrel, right turn around head barrel and back between base barrels and markers to cross finish line. Trophy and six ribbons. \$ 30; 25; 20; 15; 10.
- CLASS 8-STIRRUP RACE. Running start, rider races to a barrel and picks up baton out of it and proceeds to a second barrel which has a stirrup on it. Rider has to put the baton through the stirrup and proceed to the third barrel, circle it and race back to the first barrel when he places both baton and stirrup in the barrel successfully. Horse must enter and return between markers. Trophy and six ribbons. \$ 25; 20; 15; 10; 5.
- CLASS 9-PARADE HORSE CLASS. Entries shall be shown under stock saddle with silver, mexican or other type of colourful equipment. Entries should carry full mane, braided if desired, and a full undocked tail. An ornamental tie-down is permissible. The parade horse shall be shown at the walk and at parade gate. Trophy and six ribbons. \$ 25, 20; 15; 10; 5.
- CLASS 10-RING RACE. Three sides of the arena are set up with rings suspended from wooden posts approx. six feet above the ground. Running start, rider is to enter through starting posts and circle arena spearing rings on a wooden dowel. Rider must keep rings on the dowel throughout the completed course. A five second penalty is added to the time for every ring missed. Trophy and six ribbons \$ 25, 20; 15; 10; 5.
- CLASS 11-POLE BENDING. The course consists of six poles in a straight row, 18 feet apart with starting and finishing line 20 feet from the first pole. Upon signal from the starter, rider starts from a standing start and races to the sixth pole, keeping to the right of the poles, then turns on the sixth pole and passes successive poles on alternative sides, turns the first pole and returns in the same manner. After turning the sixth pole the second time, rider races to the finish line. TROPHY and six ribbons. \$ 25; 20; 15; 10; 5.
- CLASS 12-KEYHOLE RACE. Running start. Rider races to keyhole, circle within keyhole, return to finish line through opening. Measurements of keyhole entrance 4 feet wide, 10 feet long into a circle of 20 feet in diameter. Trophy and six ribbons. \$ 25, 20; 15; 10; 5.
- CLASS 13-LADIES BARREL RACE. Approved by the Ontario Girl's barrel racing association. Similar to the open barrel race. Trophy and six ribbons. \$ 30; 25; 20; 15; 10.
- CLASS 14-PATCH RACE. A team consists of one man and one woman. Race will be run in heats of not more than ten. Men on horse back at one end of arena will run to the opposite end where his partner will be kneeling on one knee. Man will dismount holding horse and will lie across partners knee and she will sew a patch on the seat of his pants. (Preferably the pocket.) The patch must be securely sewn on all four corners. Lady will mount horse and man will lead horse back across the finish line. Disqualification if patch is not securely sewn. Trophy and six ribbons. \$ 25; 20; 15; 10; 5.





## General Conditions:

There will be 30 available positions in this event. The Canadian Equestrian Team Members will have a bye for two of his or her horses into the competition. There will be a qualifying round for the remaining positions on Saturday at 5:00 P.M. No rider may ride more than three horses in the Grand Prix.

## Class Conditions:

To jump two rounds. The first round competing over a Grand Prix type course of approximately 14 obstacles. The second round competing over a shortened and raised course of approximately 6 - 8 obstacles. The Committee reserves the right to limit the second round to only the top 50% of competitors. In the second round competitors will jump in the reverse order of faults accumulated in the first round. In the event of a tie for 1st place only, a jump-off will be held with time to count in the first jump-off.

SCORING: FEI Table "A" - 400 meter per minute. Please refer to the article "WHAT IS A GRAND PRIX?"

WEIGHT: Ladies and Gentlemen 165 lbs.

## ORIGINAL RULING OF THE OLYMPIC PRIX DES NATIONS

As a matter of interest we are quoting the original ruling of the Olympic Prix des Nations below, as it applies exactly to today's event:

The Prix des Nations or the show-jumping competition in which Canada won its only Gold Medal in the 1968 Olympics in Mexico is the last event in the Olympic Games, and is followed by the Closing Ceremony. The obstacles, 13 or 14 in number, necessitate 16 to 20 jumps at a minimum height of 1.30 meters (4 ft. 4 in.) and a maximum height of 1.60 meters (5 ft. 4 in.) with only 2 upright obstacles at the latter height, and a water jump with a spread of 4.50 meters (15 ft.), including a low fence on the takeoff side. Spread obstacles (open ditch, bars, spa and oxer) should have a span of 1.50 to 2.20 meters (5 ft. to 7 ft. 4 in.) The length of the course should not exceed 1,100 meters (3,670 ft.) Exceeding the time limit is penalized by a quarter of a point for each second over, but completion under the time limit offers no premium. Performance penalties are for disobedience, knockdowns, falls of horse or rider, and elimination on a third disobedience. A jump-off over six obstacles from 1.40 to 1.80 meters (4 ft. 8 in. to 6 ft.) in height is mandatory both for individual competitors and for teams, in case of a tie, with no penalties for time except in the event of a tie, in which case the better time will determine the winner.

# WHAT IS A GRAND PRIX ?

## A Test

A Grand Prix Jumping Event is the supreme test of the abilities of horse and rider. Today you will see the type of competition in which Canada won the Gold Medal at the 1968 Olympic Games in Mexico City. There, however, the event was scored as a team competition, on a total point basis for three riders. This afternoon we present an Individual Grand Prix event, in which each horse and rider are on their own.




## The Course

The course contains 17 obstacles in all. However, under the scoring system there are only 14 jumps, as the Combinations, or closely spaced fences, are scored as one fence. The rider begins the course when he passes between the electric timing device in front of the first jump, and completes it when he has passed through the finish flags, when another timer stops the clock. No assistance is allowed the rider while he is on the course.



## Time

There is a maximum time allowed to negotiate the course, to be announced. A rider exceeding this time limit will incur Time Faults at the rate of 1/4 fault per second. This time allowance is calculated on the basis of the length of the course, over the actual route the average rider will travel. It is a tight time limit, considering the immense size of the obstacles: over smaller fences a horse and rider can naturally go much faster. Therefore, no rider can afford to waste one second on the course without being in danger of gaining "Time Faults," and he must go on as fast, yet as carefully as he can. You will find a space on your score sheet for "Time Faults" which will be announced after each rider has completed the course.



# Refusals



A horse which refuses to jump an obstacle, and comes to a stop in front of it, incurs 3 Faults. If he refuses a second time, whether at the same fence or at a later fence, he gains 6 Faults. A third refusal means elimination. If in refusing a jump the horse knocks down part of the fence, the bell is sounded and the clock is stopped. The rider is penalized by 6 seconds, but he is then free to move around until the bell signals that the fence has been reset and he may again attempt to jump it.

# Combinations

A combination is a series of obstacles arranged in a line which are considered for scoring purposes to be one fence. There may be two jumps, approximately one stride apart, or three fences with a stride between each. Or there may be three fences with one stride between the first two, and two strides before the third. If a horse refuses at the second or third jump of such a series, he must return to the first and renegotiate them all again. If he refuses the first fence, and knocks part of it down in so doing, then although the clock is stopped while the fence is reset, the horse has 6 seconds added to his time. A similar occurrence at the second element of the combination incurs an 8 second penalty, and at the third jump 10 seconds.



# Faults

Jumping Faults are computed on the basis of 4 Faults for each knockdown. It does not count if a horse merely touches a fence: the actual height of the fence must be lowered. All the obstacles are strongly constructed, and it takes more than a slight tick of a hoof to dislodge these fences.



# Falls




A fall of the horse or rider is penalized by 8 faults. The fall must occur within the course to incur faults, so that the rider who can hang on until his horse crosses through the finish flags is safe! A horse is said to have fallen when his shoulders and quarters have touched the ground—thus a stumble of his front or hind legs is not a fall. A rider falls when he is separated from his horse so as to necessitate remounting. These riders can often do amazing things to stay aboard!


# Total Score

There are two rounds over an identical course to the Grand Prix. The winner is the rider with the lowest cumulative score of the two rounds, including both Time and Jumping Faults. If there is a tie for first place, then there will be a further jump-off between the tied riders over a shortened course. This round is timed, and in case of equality of jumping faults again, time is the deciding factor. As these jump-offs are the most exciting part of any equestrian event, with each rider going as fast as he dares by cutting corners and taking chances, we hope there will be a tie in today's North American Grand Prix!

# Fences



# The Water Jump



The water jump, approximately 14', has a small fence on the take-off side to encourage the horse to jump. Once in the air, he must spread high and wide to clear it. On the landing side is a white tape, at the edge of the water, and the horse's hoofs must not touch this tape. There is a special water jump judge to closely watch just this obstacle. This is a very difficult fence to jump with no faults, for most horses realize that the water is not deep and they can land right in it without harm!

This obstacle is thus as much a test of training and obedience as of ability, and as such an obstacle is not often encountered in Canada or the United States, many of the horses in these countries do not yet know how to negotiate them properly. Water jumps are common in Europe. Faults are scored the same as for a knockdown, with four faults to the horse which puts a hoof on the tape or in the water. Even if the animal lands completely in the water, he only gets four faults.

# Off Course

Any rider who does not follow the route of the course as outlined in the course diagram posted outside the stadium, is Off Course and automatically eliminated. The bell will sound once he has gone off course, which could be if he jumps a fence out of order or makes an unauthorized circle.

# Weights

There is a minimum weight of 165 lbs. required of each rider in this event. Ladies, usually the lighter riders, and some lighter men must often carry lead weights affixed to pads under their saddles. These appear like a form of saddlebag. Each rider is weighed before and after his performance, carrying onto the scales with him his saddle and weight leads. As 'dead-weight' is harder for the horse to carry, it can be seen that a slim lady rider who must carry many pounds of lead is actually at a disadvantage to a gentleman rider who more closely meets the weight requirements.

A DRESSAGE EXHIBITION

RIDDEN BY

MISS CHRISTILOT HANSON

DRESSAGE is a new word to most of the Canadian public . . . in fact, to many horse enthusiasts.

It means "gymnastic training", which comes from the French verb "dresser" meaning to train.

Dressage is the basis of all equestrian sport; jumping, three-day, pleasure, etc. If you teach a horse to halt, or to rein back, you are practising dressage to a degree.

Dressage competitions are also new to North America, although they are an integral part of most European Horse Shows.

In dressage competitions, horse and rider are asked to go through a prescribed test, graded for young horses, and more advanced horses. Judges evaluate the performance and award a score for the performance. The best score wins!

At the international level, the tests are ridden from memory, and are intricate and difficult. They involve such movements as collected and extended trot, half passes in canter, flying changes, pirouettes, piaffe and passage. The rider strives to ride his horse through all the movements with accuracy, brilliance, and above all, an air of ease. The horse and rider must look in harmony with one

another, no head tossing or fighting one another!

Miss Hanson is unable to tell us for certain, if she will ride her 10 year old chestnut gelding "Armanac" with whom she won in Cali, Columbia or Mr. Bronfman's Trakehner Stallion "Bon Vivant".

Since being the youngest competitor ever in any Olympics at the 1964 Tokyo Games Miss Hanson has won such titles as United States Junior Dressage Champion, 1968 Ontario Dressage Champion, 1969 3rd prize in Aachen International Horse Show and in 1970 not only the U. S. Dressage Champion on "Bonne Annee", but also the U.S. Reserve Champion on "Bon Vivant"! And now 2 gold medals at the Pan-American Games this year. Miss Hanson has earned her title many fold as Canadian Horsewoman of the year as chosen by the Canadian Horse Show Association.


A writer by profession, Miss Hanson has published her recollections at the Tokyo Games in her book "Canadian Entry".



