Hudson Valley Trip

Muriel and I joined a United Empire Loyalist trip touring the Hudson Valley. This journey started at Albany, New York, and continued south to see many Dutch, Huguenot and Palatine sites. Two years ago we took a similar trip through the Mohawk Valley. This time two buses and about 110 people joined the tour. On these trips you always learn something or meet someone. I met Lloyd Redick and his brother Harve, who research the Redick name. Nathaniel Gaffield's son, James, married Anna Reddick. After his death she married Abel Hubble. We discovered the two families were connected through Anna's father, Philip. Lloyd gave me the following information, some of which is shown in my father's book, "The Loyalists in Ontario." Here's the information he passed on, note the different spelling of the surname, also Catherine Redick may belong to another family, that of John Reddick.

A Champion Story

Last May, Adrianne Champion sent the following story about her husband's family.

Jay's paternal grandmother Margaret Dexter, born in Nova Scotia, an only child. Her father was Isreal Dexter, captain of the clipper ship "Austria" whose home port was Windsor, N.S. (Jay has a painting of the ship, by the way. It is about 3' x 4')

Her mother was Maggie Dexter. Margaret lived on board the ship with her parents until 1899 when she was about 15 or 16. She had been "home schooled" by her mother to this point, but it was decided that she should go to school in Nova Scotia, and so she was sent to live with relatives when her parents left on their next voyage. The ship sailed from Mobile, Ala. for Belfast, Ireland via the Cape of Good Hope with a load of lumber. It was never heard of again! Apparently some wreckage was found in the Atlantic, but no word of Captain Dexter, his wife or crew. Jay has papers informing the shipping company of the disaster along with crew lists etc.

To get back to the story. After Margaret's parents were lost, she lived with relatives for a while, and then was sent west for her health, met Jay's grandfather, and lived happily ever after in Alberta, raising a family of Jay's dad had no information 4 children. regarding Margaret's family at all, and she seemed to have had no family background other than the above. Since starting to poke around on the Internet Jay has been in touch with a number of people, and in a roundabout way, was given the name of woman in Nova Scotia who was researching her family names, Burgess and Dexter. Jay got in touch with her, told her who he was etc., and gave her the information he had regarding his grandmother's family.

After a few messages had been exchanged, Jay got an E-mail from this woman that said "Have I got a surprise for you". Needless to say we were both dying of curiosity. The big news finally arrived last week. The message started out with "This is your surprise! Margaret Dexter was not an only child." She was not even a Dexter, but the sixth child of George and Florence Burgess!!!

Apparently her mother died when she was about 3 years old and she was adopted by her mother's sister, Maggie Dexter and her husband Isreal. The lady Jay had been in touch with is the granddaughter of Margaret's oldest sister, and thus is a cousin of Jay's. The information she sent is all written down in her family's bible, so there is little doubt it is genuine. She also sent copies of the wills of both Maggie and Isreal that refer to Margaret as their adopted daughter, Margaret Burgess Dexter.

Jay has been beside himself with mirth ever since getting this information, as he always said that there had to be something strange about his grandmother's background as her children knew so little of her history other than the romantic story of life aboard ship and the ships loss etc. Now we know. What is strange is why the big secret. It could be said that as she was just a small child when the adoption took place maybe she didn't know, but when her parents were lost she was named executrix of their estate and both wills state categorically that she was adopted. It also raises the question of why her natural father didn't take her back after his remarriage 2 years after his first wife died. At the very least you would think that there would have been some contact with siblings over time. Jay feels sure his father didn't know any of this or he would have said. Also, he would have been devastated as he thought the sun rose and set on his mother, and in effect, she lied to her children about her parentage. As Jay's dad, Dexter, was executor of her estate we would be willing to bet she was smart enough not to have left any papers etc. behind to give her away.

All this leads to another problem. Jay is named after his dad, John Dexter Champion, the Dexter being his grandmother's maiden name (ha!), so should he now change the Dexter to Burgess? Should his father now be referred to as Burgess Champion? Where does this put them both legally? Should I plant the garden this week?
