

NORTHUMBERLAND HILLS HOSPITAL

On Wednesday, October 22, 2003 patients at the Northumberland Health Care Centre will take part in the move to the Northumberland Hills Hospital, located at 1000 DePalma Drive off Burnham Street near the Highway 401. During this time, hospital staff will be working closely with Health Care Relocations (HCR) of Peterborough, professional movers who have facilitated the moves of health care facilities throughout North America.

"This move has been two years in the planning," comments Brenda Weir, Relocation Co-ordinator for the Northumberland Hills Hospital. "Together, we plan to make this move as smooth as possible. We thank our patients, their families, visitors and the community at large in advance for their patience and understanding during this time."

On the day of the patient move, visitors will be welcome from 2 p.m. to 7 p.m. in accordance with the hospital's regular visiting hours. Nursing staff will discuss any special patient needs, and review the move plan with patients and families a few days prior to the move.

The day before the move, family members will receive the new room number where their loved one will be staying. Dedicated volunteers and additional staff will be on hand to verify patient room numbers in the new hospital's front lobby (in case of unexpected changes), and to assist with wayfinding throughout the facility.

Move day will be a day filled with activity. Patients will receive breakfast earlier than usual, and then will be prepared by nursing staff for the move. Patients will then be transported by ambulance or Wheel-tram vans, and will be accompanied by nursing staff as required. Patients will be received at the new facility by nursing staff. Once patients have been made comfortable in their new rooms, lunch will be served.

Please note that the hospital's main phone number will remain the same at the new hospital: (905) 372-6811. Extension numbers, however, will change. Switchboard staff will be able to assist members of the public, where necessary, with any phone calls that need to be made to the new facility.
