Is president of the Stirling Agricultural Show, immediate past vice-chairman of the British Ploughing Association and now a vice-president of the British Ploughing Association and area representative for Scotland. Is past president of the local and area branches of the National Farmers' Union. Is a noted plowing match judge and judge of Clydesdale horses. Breeds Clydesdales, the first foal he ever bred was shipped to Canada as a fouryear-old and her granddaughter won the famed Cawder Cup in Glasgow in 1945.
