A Fair and Reasonable Offer

The Government of Ontario has offered OPSEU members a fair and reasonable wage offer over three years. This offer is similar to those already accepted by other Ontario public service unions. OPSEU has rejected this offer and is now off strike. The Government remains available to return to the table at any time.

The Government's offer includes:

An **up to 10 per cent** raise for all staff over a three-year contract made up of:

- a **5.96 per cent** raise for all staff over a three-year contract;
- a one per cent raise in the first year in exchange for productivity and efficiency gains; and
