The Normal Child.

A new kind of scientific work is being carried on in Washington, in which the testing of 25,000 school children, mentally, morally and physically, is the preliminary step. Dr. Arthur McDoneducation, and the results when arranged and tabulated are expected to throw valuable light upon a number of mooted questions concerning the race.

For example, it is desired to know whether boys of the laboring class are less bright than the sons of the well-todo. Are they as well nourished? In London, not long ago, investigation proved that the children of laboring people in that metropolis were better nourished—that is to say, weighed more at the same age-than those belonging to higher social strata, the latter being fed on too much candy and cake. The work here being untinished, conclusions cannot be stated. To begin with, the beight and sitting height of each child were taken.

Plain of Troy.

The plain of Troy, so famed and Sourishing in ancient days, is now barren and desoiste. The sculptor sees no statues, the architect no remains, and the painter anything but a picturesque view. It is fit only for the collegian or the moralist. The classic Scamander is but a muddy stream, winding through an uncultivated plain, covered with stunted oaks, underwood and rushes.

At the opposite extremity of the plain stand the tombs of Hector and Achilles -that of the latter near the Hellespont, where the Greek fleet was moored Near is the grave of his friend Pratroclus. All their glories are now reduced to a few tumuli, about thirty feet high. The Scamander is between 200 and 250 feet broad and very muddy, having the

appearance of being much flooded. Further up the plain its course becomes undistinguishable among the marshes. After passing a smaller river you arrive at an ancient tumulus, not far from the shore. What is most strikcenter. Above are the remains of a square basement, on which the column of the tomb may have formerly stood. On your return you see the tombs of Wheaton,


