Removing Impurities From Wools. For above purpose (according to the process just patented in France and England by C. Delerue, of Roubaix, France), the wool sliver is fed by feed rollers in between a pair of cylinder brushes, and from them it is removed by a rapidly revolving comb in contact with which there is a more rapidly revolving cylindrical brush with a tapered casing, having an opening through which part of the periphery of the comb projects to meet the brush. By the current of air caused by the rapid revolution of the brush, the wool stripped by it off the comb is projected toward the small end of the casing, where it is caught by a pair of hollow wire gauze cylinders, and by them delivered to a pair of feed rollers to be again subjected to the action of a cylindrical comb and brush. These wire gauze cylinders, feed rollers, and combs, and the brushes and their casings, are repeated eight or ten times in the machine, the wool passing in

### ATLANTA SHOW

SMALL AFFAIR.

The Fair Southern City Is Already Tak-Airs Similar to These Ex hibited in Chicago Prior to the World's Fair.

SITE lected for the Atlanta exposition is a natural amphitheater inclosing about 189 acres, two miles or so from the center of the city and in the direction that the wealthy folk are following in choosing their building


