EDITOR REPORTER:

I have read with much interest the editorial in your last issue on the subject of a new cemetery, and if you will permit me to do so I would like to assist you in keeping the ball rolling.

It would seem to be a natural failing with us to neglect this important provision until such time as the course of events brings it forcibly before us. To then have things as we would wish, is, of course, out of the question, and we can but make the most of what we have, and register our vow for improvement. I have been accustomed to seeing a cemetery so conducted as to be used on Sundays much the same as a park; it is visited by people in large numbers, both in carriages and on foot, whether they have friends there or not; the grounds are attractive, and all feel an interest. I do not think this state of affairs can be said to prevail here outside of one or two special days each year, and it is not to be wondered at. It is not, however, because those who have gone were any less dear to us, but because we are at a disadvantage.

I think the plan outlined for selling shares (lots) on the installment plan, when desired, an excellent one. Purchasers with holdings ever so small on the start, would become interested at once, and their burden could be made so light as to be hardly noticeable. The time seems ripe for a move, and I am told that some excellent sites have been offered the committee, and with a little concerted action on the part of our citizens there is no doubt but this can be settled in a manner that will indicate to our neighbors that our zeal was not exhausted with the completion of the finest water plant in the country.

Our ministers could be of very material assistance in this good cause, by announcing from the pulpit our meeting of the 31st at Thompson's Hall.

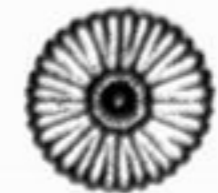
