SCISSORS AND PASTE.
Wheat and Chaff Gleaned from Our
Esteemed Contemporaries.
The C. B. & Q. found that they were losing lots of their passenger trade by the order that made bicycles excess baggage and charged for at the rate of twenty-five cents each, and have recinded the order so that now bicycles are checked as baggage as before. A rule of that kind would not stand unless all the roads entered into an agreement, and then it is doubtful. There is no reason why the roads cannot carry a "bike" as well as a trunk.

Another sad accident occurred here Tuesday. While the way freight was doing its switching on the west end, brakeman E. J. Stearns, was caught between the bumpers and crushed just below the chest, in the pit of the stomach. He was seen and taken out from between the rails immediately and lived but twenty minutes. He was a young married man and leaves a wife and child in Savanna, Ill. This makes the third man killed by accident within the limit of the switches inside of two years.—Hinkley Review.

Another sad accident occurred last Saturday evening about two miles north of Naperville, on the Wheaton road. Anton Frederick had been attending the horse market at Naperville and was returning to the home of Marris Neff, a brother-in-law, where he made his home when not working around by the day. Some one attempted to drive by the wagon on which Mr. Frederick was riding, he being seated on a keg of beer, and another man on a barrel of salt. While turning from the main road to a side road the man on the barrel of salt fell off and Mr. Frederick turned to look at him, lost his balance, fell, and had his head crushed by the wheel. He died almost instantly. The remains were brought to Wheaton, an inquest held and were then taken to the Catholic cemetery, Naperville, for interment. The jury found it an accidental death, with no one to blame. Mr. Frederick had been a day laborer in the vicinity of Lisle, was 60 years of age and had no children. His wife died several years ago. The man who fell from the barrel of salt was not seriously injured.—Illinoisan.

Fox River, ordinarily a stream of sufficient size to supply power for a dozen milling industries in this city, has reached the lowest stage in its history. Not a mill wheel here has been turned by its current for a week, and to-day the river bed is virtually dry. At places a person can wade across without wetting his feet, and above the dam only a broad expanse of mud stretches for a mile up stream, where the mill pond used to be.

For five years the river has been gradually growing smaller, and at the present outlook in five years more will go dry entirely. All the Aurora factories and mills dependent upon waterpower have abandoned the river in disgust and have put in electric motors, receiving their power from the street railways, whose 2,500 horse-power plant is now taxed to its utmost capacity.
Black bass and other fish, in which the river usually abounds, are penned in the few deep pools, and anglers take them out by hundreds. Recent heavy rains have no effect on the stream whatever. At Elgin, Geneva, and other places the situation is the same, and factories not having steam power are shut down.
