HIATT AND GROTE DROWNED.
The remains of L. I. Hiatt and Wm. H. Grote, two prominent citizens of Wheaton, were brought to that city Sunday afternoon from Powers Lake, Wis., where they were drowned while out fishing Saturday afternoon. Both left Wheaton Saturday morning about 8 o'clock with a party of friends for a day's fishing in the lake, which is about 60 miles north of Wheaton. They arrived at the lake about 10 o'clock and immediately after dinner Grote and Hiatt rented a small rowboat and pulled out into the lake to fish. About 5 o'clock their friends in the party, who had gone to another part of the lake to fish, in rowing back saw the upturned boat in which the two friends had gone out together. A search party was organized and the bodies of the two men recovered about 8 o'clock Saturday night. The friends of the two men were notified and Henry Grote, a brother of William H., went immediately to take charge of the remains. An inquest was held at Powers Lake Sunday morning and a verdict of accidental drowning returned.
