REPORT OF GRAND JURY. To the Honorable C. W. Upton, judge

of the circuit court of DuPage county:

The grand jury for the October term of the current year herewith submit the following report, viz: That we have examined the county farm, poor house and buildings, and report that the improvements made thereon, by the board of supervisors, upon the

recommendation made by the grand jury of the March term of this year, have been substantially carried out; that the same was necessary; that the sanitary conditions, appurtenances and appointments of the buildings and grounds are upon the most approved plan, challenging favorable comparison with any similar institution in the country.

That we have had access to contracts and expense accounts, and are satisfied that economy and good judgment Lave

That the institution is judiciously managed, self sustaining, and in favorable seasons accumulating a surplus fund.

We further believe the taxpayers of this county will cheerfully contribute of their means in the satisfaction of knowing that the poor and unfortunate of the county are provided with a comfortable home, and that the dictates of humanity are all complied with.

The grand jury endorse and commend the action of the board of supervisors and authorities of DuPage county in their efforts to capture the murderers The Chicago Suburban Electric road of Edward Ott, and in view of the atrocity of the crime and expense already incurred, urge a continuance of effort, until crowned with success, if in their judgment such result can be obtained at any reasonable cost

We further recommend that the board of supervisors, either by its president or some authorized officer of the reasonable period after the commission of a capital offense in this county, shall make such liberal offer of reward (the same to be paid upon arrest or conviction) as to make it an object and stimulate activity by officers and citizens in

We have inspected the county jail, finding the same well appointed, clean and safe. We learned that the water supply for water back, ranges and heating boiler, is entirely of hard water, results in incrustation of lime, necessitating frequent removal of the water back of ranges, etc., which can be prevented by the use of soft water.

We therefore recommend to the board of supervisors that a pump be attached to the cistern and a tank be provided. with connections to the range and boiler, and so get the benefit of soft water, of which there is an abundant

The grand jury further report that they have carefully considered all indictable offences brought to their attention and herewith return all true bills found, and all cases in which no bill was found. The grand jury epressed a sense of obligation to the district attorpay for efficient aid rendered, and also \$ 38 50 to all the officers of the court for assistance in the discharge of their duties.

sober people in the hurlyburly of nations but the figures of the internal revenue commissioner for the last year are enough to make a temperance crank stagger without a drop of whisky or

We distilled last year 87,346,834 gallons of liquor, not including 1,430,353 gallons of brandy, making in all 88, 777,187 gallons of alcoholic spirits. Expert bartenders estimate sixty-three drinks to the gallon. Therefore there were 5,604,062,891 drinks produced in this country.

A conservative estimate of how much was imbibed across counters is about 37,000,000 gallons of whisky, brandy and other distilled spirits, or in other words we drank 6,090,000,000 glasses of whisky, for which we paid over the bar \$609,000,000, or \$5,000,000 mere than all the annual appropriations of congress combined.

This represents a consumption of 100 classes of whisky each year for every man, woman and child between the rock-bound Pacific and the storm-tossed Atlantic, or, counting only the male adults, 500 glasses per week each. Of beer the figures are equally aston-

ishing. The consumption was 31,962, 943 barrels; that is 12,785,169,200 glasses, representing the expenditure for this mode of Teutonic hilarity of \$617,258,400, or about 10 cents for each In the neighborhood of 220 glasses

are charged up in this calculation against each of us as our annual allowance. Therefore, if we do not average our daily glass we may be sure that our neighbors are getting the benefit of our abstinence. 
