 Petition for a sidewalk on the west side of Foote street, commencing at the corner of Franklin street and running north to Chicago Ave., was read and on motion referred to street and alley committee.
 Petition for a sidewalk on the North side of Maple Ave. extending from its present terminus, opposite the Germar church, to the western limits was read and on motion the ordinance committee was instructed to draft ordinance for the same. Carried.
 Claim ordinance No. 28 read and ordered placed upon its passage. Those voting aye: Bunge, Gallup, Moss and Wetten. Carried.
