

SIDEWALK ORDINANCE NO. 14.

An ordinance providing for the construction of a sidewalk on the west side of Foote street between Chicago avenue and Prairie avenue. Be it ordained by the president and

board of trustees of the village of Downers Grove in the county of DuPage and state Section 1. That a sidewalk be con-

About sixty persons attended the structed on the west side of Foote street between Chicago ave and Prairie ave in said village of Downers Grove, Ill., and immediately in front of the following lots and lands, to-wit: Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 Prince & Co's addition to said village of Downers Grove.

Sec. 2. That the whole cost of said walk shall be levied upon said lots and lands in proportion to their frontage upon said sidewalk.

Sec. 3. Said sidewalk shall be constructed under the supervision and to the acceptance of the street commissioner of said village, and the same shall be of the width and constructed of the materials and in the manner as follows, to-wit: Said walk shall be four feet and eight inches in width and constructed of the best number one common pine lumber. The planks shall be said crosswise and be not less that 1% inches in thickness, nor less than six or more than ten inches in width. Same to be supported by and securely nailed with wire nails (20 penny) to three pine stringers not less than 2x4 inches in size, securely bound together at the joints. Said stringers to rest on flat stone blocking or eedar posts.

Sec. That the owners of the said lots

and parcels of land are hereby required to construct said sidewalk in front of their respective lots, agreeably to the provis-ions of Section 3 of this ordinance within thirty days after the publication thereof. Sec. 5. Upon default of any owner or owners to construct that part of said walk immediately in front of his or their respective lot or lots within thirty days after the publication of this ordinance, it shall be the duty of the said street commissioner to eatise the same to be constructed in behalf of said village at the street commissioner shall certify to a bill of the cost of said walk constructed by the village in front of said lots, showing in ials, laying down and supervision, and file it in the office of the village clerk, together with a list of the lots and parcels of land touching upon the line of said sidewalk, the names of the owners thereof and the frontage of their respective lots on said
