Interesting News Notes Ruthlessly Mashed from Neighboring Contemporaries.

A dispatch from Oshkosh, Wis., says that Charles Long of Naperville, Ill., is in jail charged with forging his father's name, Frederick Long, to a \$100 check, which he gave the Oshkosh Furniture company in payment of \$91 worth of goods. He was captured at Appleton.

Andrew Sandberg's trial for the murder of Harry Bannister at Lemont last fall came to an end in Chicago this week, when the jury returned a verdict of guilty, and he was sentenced to fourteen years in the penitentiary. Presumably this ends the case, unless a new trial be granted. The verdict is generally accepted as a just one.

The LaSalle county grand jury has been doing some wholesale work. It has not only indicted the saloon-keepers of the county who have persistently disobeyed the law, but also the mayor or president of the village board in the cities and towns where such violators reside. LaSalle, Peru, Utica and Kangley officials were thus treated.

The man who wants a bicycle, but is waiting until prices are reduced to a reasonable point, is likely soon to be able to gratify his desires. Eastern sewing machine companies that have recently entered the field as competitors with the regular manufacturers, announce that they will put 1,000,000 on the market this season at \$25 apiece.

The village authorities of LaGrange have been active since the raid on the blind pigs made last week Friday night. They feel greatly encouraged over the manifestation of confidence made by the people at the mass meeting Sunday evening and as they are now plentifully supplied with the sinews of war, it is proposed to make things uncomfortably hot for violators of the law.

Moseley & Co., Elgin machinists, made an assignment to Captain L. M. Kelley today. The liabilities are a little in excess of \$25,000 and the assets about the same. The creditors are mostly Elgin business men and there are no preferred claims. Moseley & Co. had a national reputation as manufacturers of fine tools for jewelers and watchmakers. Their failure is due to the general depression in the watch trade.

While Geo. Ford's hired man was going to Geneva with a load of hay on Wednesday, the hind wheels came off by the dislocation of a reach while crossing the railroad track west of town. A pin in the reach caught on the rails, thus pulling the front wheels free from the load. Just then an east bound freight came along and George's hay and rack was scattered at least over an acre of territory, and George's verdict on grinding monopolies was given in a tone that spread over ten times as much territory as the hay covered.

Miss Hattie Bowen, after carrying a needle in her body for 20 years had it removed last week, by Dr. R. Selkirk, in Aurora. It had never troubled her until a few days before the operation, when she was suddenly taken with cramps in her left limb. After examination the physician told her there was a needle working into the bone and she would have to submit to an operation. The young lady could hardly believe there was a needle in her body, for she never knew of having met with any accident with one. But after the flesh had been cut away from the bone, a few inches above the knee, he found a very large needle imbedded in the bone, which, after it was taken out, was found to be perfect, with the exception of being discolored from its long contact with the flesh. The physicians think without a doubt the needle entered her body when a baby and had never made itself felt until last week.
