Driven from His Healdsburg Home, He Has Kept His Boyhood Home.

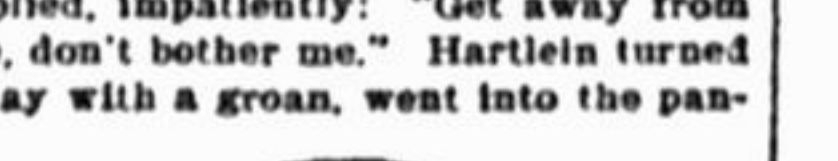

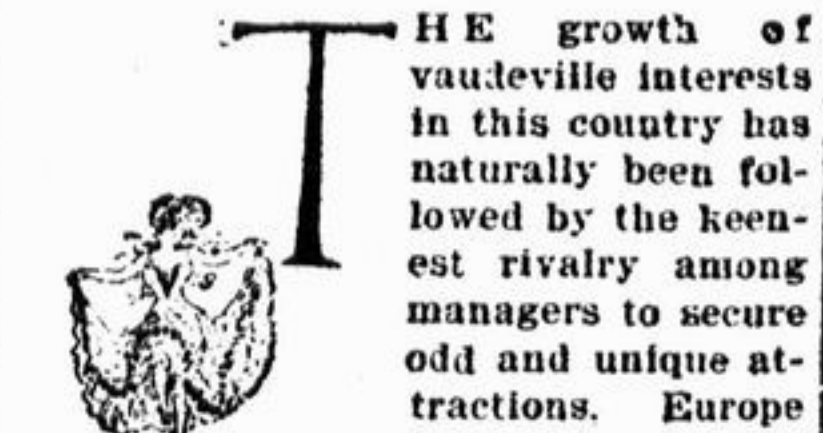

Very Wonderful Heads That Express All the Emotions of a Man—A Decided Novelty Amusing New Yorkers—A Clever Caricature.



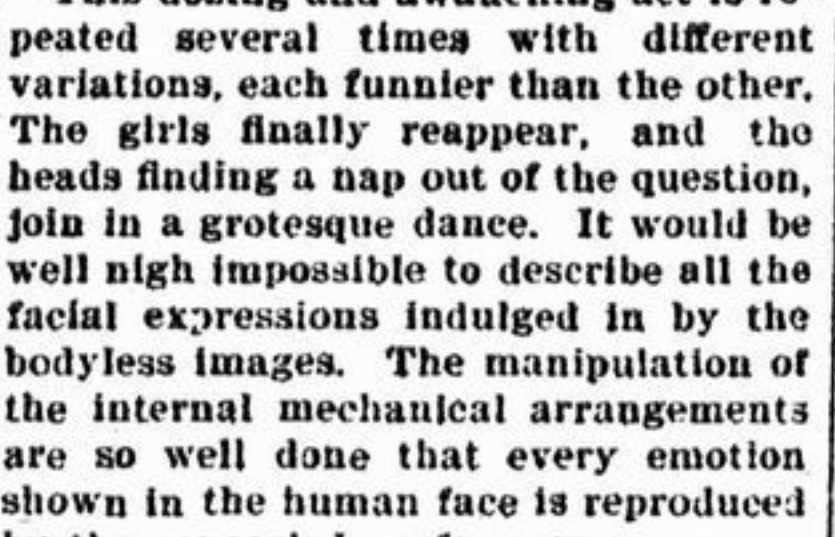
THE growth of vaudeville interests in this country has naturally been followed by the keenest rivalry among managers to secure odd and unique attractions.
