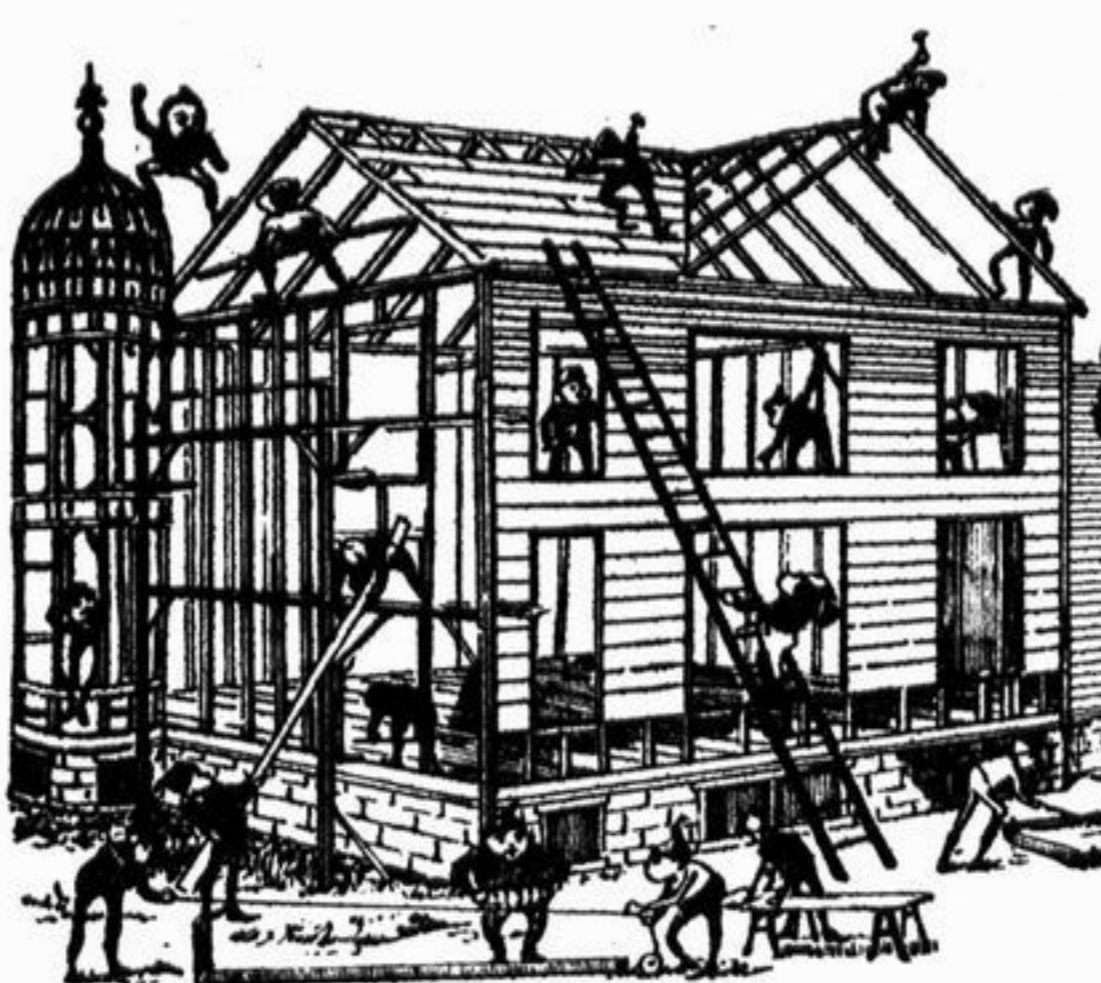
WINTER TOURS TO CALIFORNIA.
