THE COUNTY CLERKSHIP.

The vacancy in the county clerk's office caused by the death of Milton S. Ellsworth has been temporarily filled by the board of supervisors by appointing Louis Ellsworth.

VILLAGE BOARD PROCEEDINGS.

Downers Grove, Ill., May 4, 1906. The regular meeting of the month of May was called to order by President W. S. Carpenter.

The minutes of last regular, adjourned and special meetings read and approved. It was moved by Trustee Wetten and seconded by Trustee Bunge, that the old board adjourn sine-die, which was carried.

President elect C. V. Carpenter and Trustees elect E. Schultz, Charles Mochel and J. W. Hughes were then sworn in by the clerk.

The new board was called to order by President C. V. Carpenter and roll called present Trustees Bunge, Chilver, Wetten, Mochel, Hughes and Schultz.

Finance committee, Bunge, Wetten and Schultz; Improvement committee, Wetten, Hughes and Bunge; street and alley committee, Chilver, Mochel and Hughes; ordinance committee, Hughes, Chilver and Bunge; water committee, Mochel, Schultz and Wetten.

President Carpenter then made the following appointments for village officers which were confirmed by the board. Village collector, V. Simonson; village treasurer, J. W. Rogers; supt. of waterworks, J. D. Fowler; street commissioner, Wm. H. Mertz; health commissioner, James Dixon; fire marshal, Frank Blanchard; ass't. fire marshal, Ben Weatherbee; police constable, James Dixon; village attorney, M. Slusser.

It was moved and carried that the salary of superintendent of waterworks be raised from \$90.00 to \$70.00 per month, that the salary of village treasurer be \$100.00 for the year and that the village attorney receive for his services \$15.00 per month.

It was moved that the salary of street commissioner be deferred until next meeting which was carried, all voting aye.

A request from the residents of Gony's asking that Nicholas Patrick be appointed night policeman for that part of village without salary was deferred until next meeting.

There being four applications for position of policeman, no being by petition it was moved that appointment of policeman be postponed until next meeting to examine charges presented against the present officer. Motion was carried all voting aye.

Report of village treasurer was then read approved and ordered placed on file. Report of village collector read and ordered placed on file.

A petition for sidewalk on south side of Belmont street, commencing at Foote avenue and extending to village limits on the west, was then read and referred to street and alley committee to report at next meeting.

Claim ordinance No. 37 providing for the payment of certain claims was then read and was as follows to-wit: Sec. 1. Be it ordered by the president and board of trustees of the village of Downers Grove in the County of DuPage and State of Illinois, that the several claims against said village hereinafter set forth in favor of the several parties and for the several amounts hereinafter mentioned be and the same are hereby allowed and ordered paid and the clerk and president are directed to issue warrants payable to the said parties respectively out of the village funds, as specified to-wit:

The following resolution was then read relating to appointments of policemen in the village. Be it resolved by the president and board of trustees of the Village of Downers Grove in the County of DuPage and State of Illinois, that there shall be appointed for service in the Village of Downers Grove, two policemen one of whom shall be specially requested to do night service and shall receive a compensation of \$90.00 per month and the other appointee shall not be required to perform regular duty and shall receive no compensation from the village.

The resolution was adopted as read, those voting aye were Trustees Bunge, Chilver, Wetten, Mochel, Hughes and Schultz.

Petitions were then read from Bush & Simonson and W. S. Carpenter for druggists permit to sell intoxicating liquors.

It was moved to defer granting permits and that said druggists be permitted to continue under old permit until action be taken by board on granting new permits carried.
