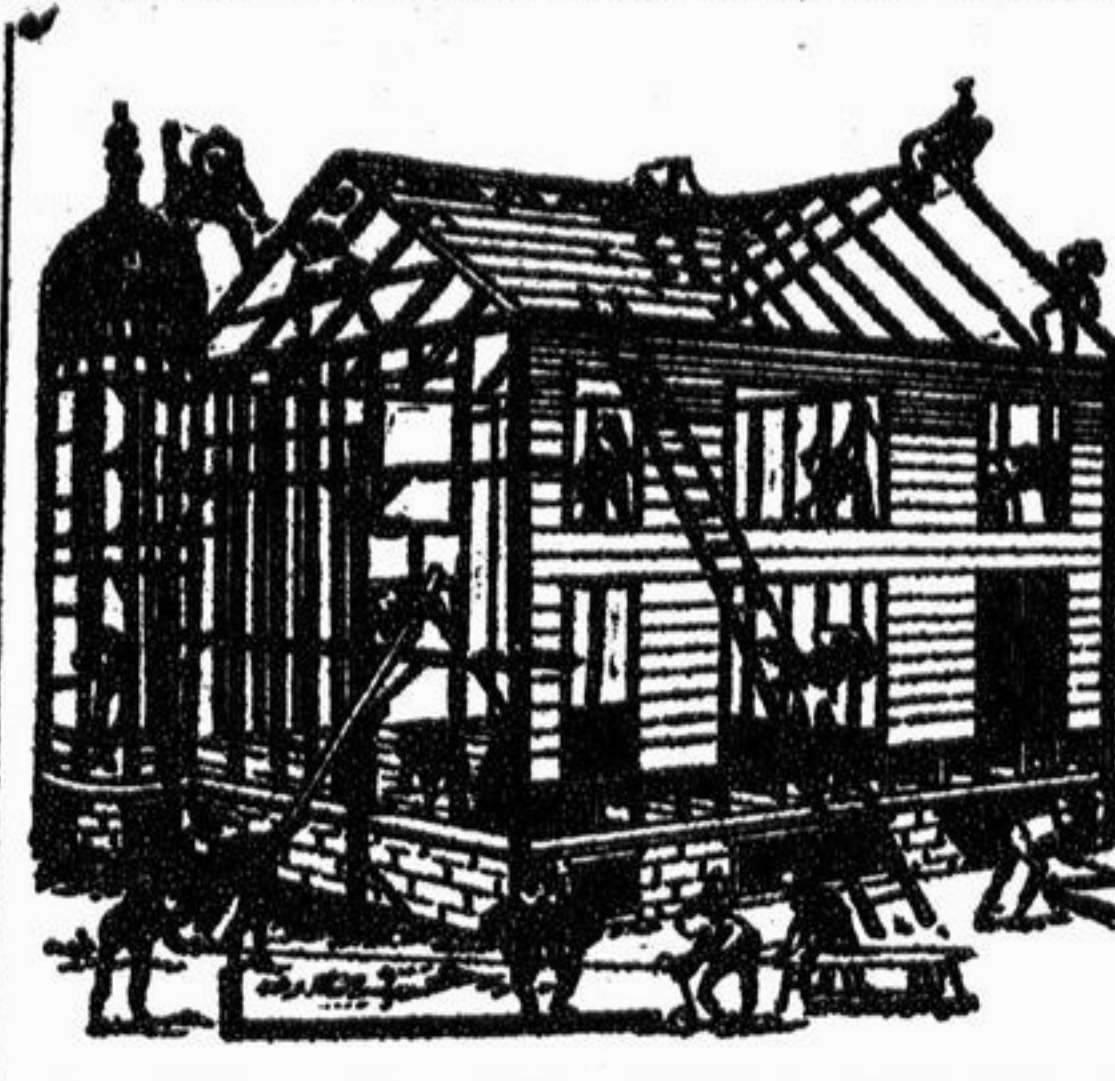

SCHOOL BOARD PROCEEDINGS.
 Downers Grove, Ill., Sept. 1, 1906.
 At the meeting of the Board of Education this evening, Messrs. Carpenter, Lindley, Nourse, Towley, Wootton and Worley were present. Minutes of meeting held August 4th were read and approved.
 Upon motion by Mr. Carpenter, the following bills were ordered paid, all voting aye:
 O J Daily, repairs on Maple Ave building \$30.27
 W L Singletery, fifteen days at \$1.50..... 22.50
 G E Downer & Co, painting and papering in both buildings..... 140.64
 R M Heveron, repairing Maple Ave roof. 35.15
 A motion was made by Mr. Carpenter that, inasmuch as our heating apparatus bonds of Thirteen Hundred (1300) Dollars, with interest, were not figured upon in our recent tax levy, the secretary be instructed to advise the township treasurer of a substitute levy of six thousand, six hundred three 64-100 (6634.64) dollars for school purposes and three thousand, six hundred, thirty-two (3632.00) dollars for building purposes. Motion was seconded by Mr. Nourse and carried, all voting aye.
 The teachers and schools committee reported that the matter of text books had had their careful attention and that the following had been adopted:
 Hyde's Language Series,
 Walsh's Arithmetic,
 Dole's American Cities,
 Brooks' Literature,
 Carhart & Chase's Physics,
 Barnett's School Zoology.
 These adoptions were made for beginning classes only and upon liberal terms. Upon motion by Mr. Nourse the report was adopted and is on file as Document No. 85.
 The following report (Document No. 86) was adopted, motion being made by Mr. Worley:
 Downers Grove, Ill., Sept. 1, 1906.
 Mr. President:—The Teachers and Schools committee would respectfully recommend that we appropriate fifty (50) dollars for the purpose of purchasing fixtures and additional materials for laboratory work. This recommendation is made in view of our serious need along that line and in consideration of an offer made by our superintendent to add to it another fifty dollars, the same to be raised by school entertainment.
 We would further recommend that three fixtures be placed in the recitation room, third floor, North building, and that we provide for the proper distribution of pupils now in that building by renting a suitable room and placing one of our teachers in charge.
 W. B. TOWLEY, Secy.
 A motion was made by Mr. Nourse that the school house, grounds and supplies committee be instructed to take immediate steps toward the renting and furnishing of a suitable room as recommended by the teachers and schools committee. Motion carried unanimously.
 Upon motion by Mr. Carpenter, the matter of non-compliance of the D. F. Morgan Boiler Company with our request, that the heating apparatus in the North building have their early attention, was referred to President Lindley and Mr. Worley with power to employ an attorney on behalf of the board if, in his judgment, it is deemed necessary. Adjourned.
