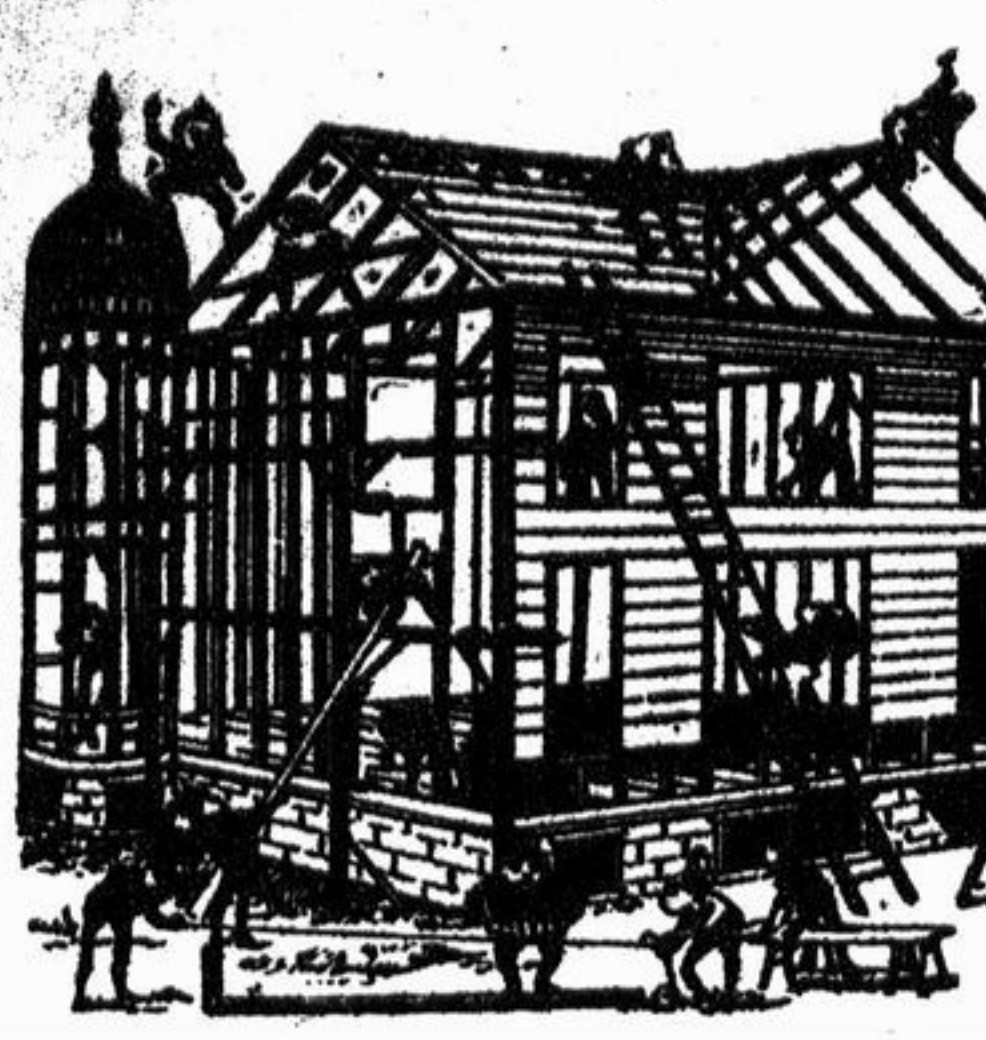

THE VOICE OF THE PEOPLE.

To the Downers Grove REPORTER:
 I have an object lesson in silver which
 I have carried in my pocket for over 30
 years. It is a Mexican silver dollar which
 I got in Mexico in 1860. At that time it
 took \$10 in greenbacks to buy five Mexi-
 can silver dollars, now after 30 years the
 conditions have been completely reversed.
 A \$5 greenback will buy ten Mexican sil-
 ver dollars. If there was no acknowl-
 edged, or fixed standard of value in primary
 money, how could the conditions, above
 mentioned, have reversed. Gold remains
 the same, and is the recognized standard
 of the commercial world in money, and all
 other values are measured by it. All other
 money changes, in accordance to the
 amount of confidence in a gold redeemer.
 As long as Mexico kept its silver on a pa-
 rity with gold, it would buy as much as
 gold. Now, you buy at half price in Mex-
 ico, if you pay in gold or redemption mo-
 ney. When Mexico went into the free and
 unlimited coinage of silver, gold went out
 of circulation, and although Mexico pro-
 duces \$15,000,000 in gold annually, it
 doesn't circulate, except in some other
 country. Mexico did all that legislation
 could do to make the silver dollar equal to
 gold. It is made a legal tender for taxes
 of all kinds, debts and duties. How does
 it work? Merchants put up the price of
 their goods just double. The government
 levies double the amount in taxes. When
 they buy foreign goods, they put up double
 the amount in silver. Nobody is cheated
 except the poor laborers who get about the
 same wages (30 to 50 cents per day) that
 they did 30 years ago, when silver was
 equal to gold. If Mexico is such a pros-
 perous country as the "silver cranks"
 would have us believe, why don't some of
 your Downers Grove "Bryanites" go there.
 There is a big demand in Mexico for jack-
 asses; they use them for all kinds of work,
 including "water supplies" for domestic
 use.

all who want work can get it, as they did
 previous to 1873. A former townsman of
 mine, who is a silverite, and one of the
 Massachusetts state committee, recently
 received a \$200 remittance from China.
 He went to a Boston bank to get it cashed,
 and was paid \$99.44. After waiting at the
 bank window for a while, the cashier
 asked him what he wanted, and he told
 him "more money." The cashier ex-
 plained that China was a silver standard
 country, and that he had got all that was
 coming. After studying it over for a day
 or two, he resigned from the state com-
 mittee and says he will vote for sound
 money. He found that free silver would
 give him one-half of what he thought was
 coming to him. That's about what would
 happen if Bryan and a free silver congress
 were to be elected. Those who have any-
 thing coming would get only one-half of
 what they expected, while those who owe
 on mortgages could pay off with one-half
 of what they expected to when the debt
 was created. Not every "mortgaged
 man" is a silverite, but about every sil-
 verite is a "mortgaged man."
 There is one curious thing about this
 campaign that is prominent in most every
 part of the country. It has brought to
 the surface a lot of "yellow dog" finan-
 ciers, who were educated in "Cain's Finan-
 cial School," and think they are leaders
 of men, when as a matter of fact they
 couldn't earn \$50 a month at anything
 and most of them will be looking out for
 a job after the silver mine owners quit put-
 ting up next week. I believe McKinley
 will receive the largest vote ever cast for
 any president of the United States.
