



Roll call noted present Trustees Hinge, Wetten, Hughes, Schultz, Chilveri and Mochel. Sidewalk ordinance No. 20 providing for

he construction of a sidewalk on the wes side of Elm street between Franklia and Jas B Rawlins to Thos J Sheean undiv 1/2 Rogers street and on the north side of Michael Kuhn to Jay C Morse shi neur and carried that said ordinance be put on its passage. Said ordinance was the put upon its passage and passed. Those voting aye were Trustees, Bunge, Wetten, Hughes and Schultz. Nays none.

Sidewalk ordinance No. 21, providing for the construction of a sidewalk on the south side of Railroad street between the cast John R Case to Gustav Swennon part sec line of lot six in Stanley's re-sub of block 1 of Gilbert's sub of lot 1 in block 1 Curtiss sub of lot 13 and the west line lot 5 in Sandall's re-sub of block 12. was regularly moved and carried that said ordinance be put upon its passage. 
