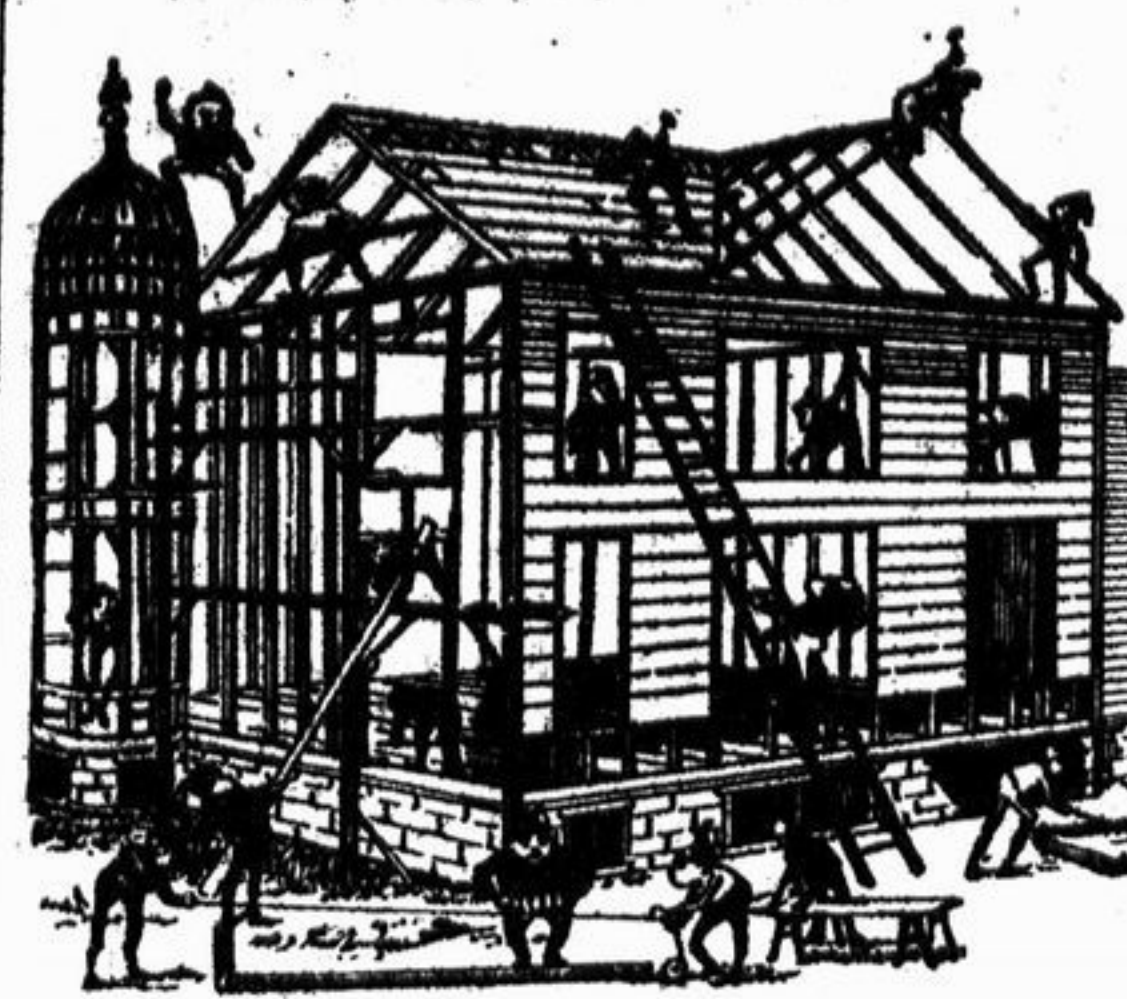

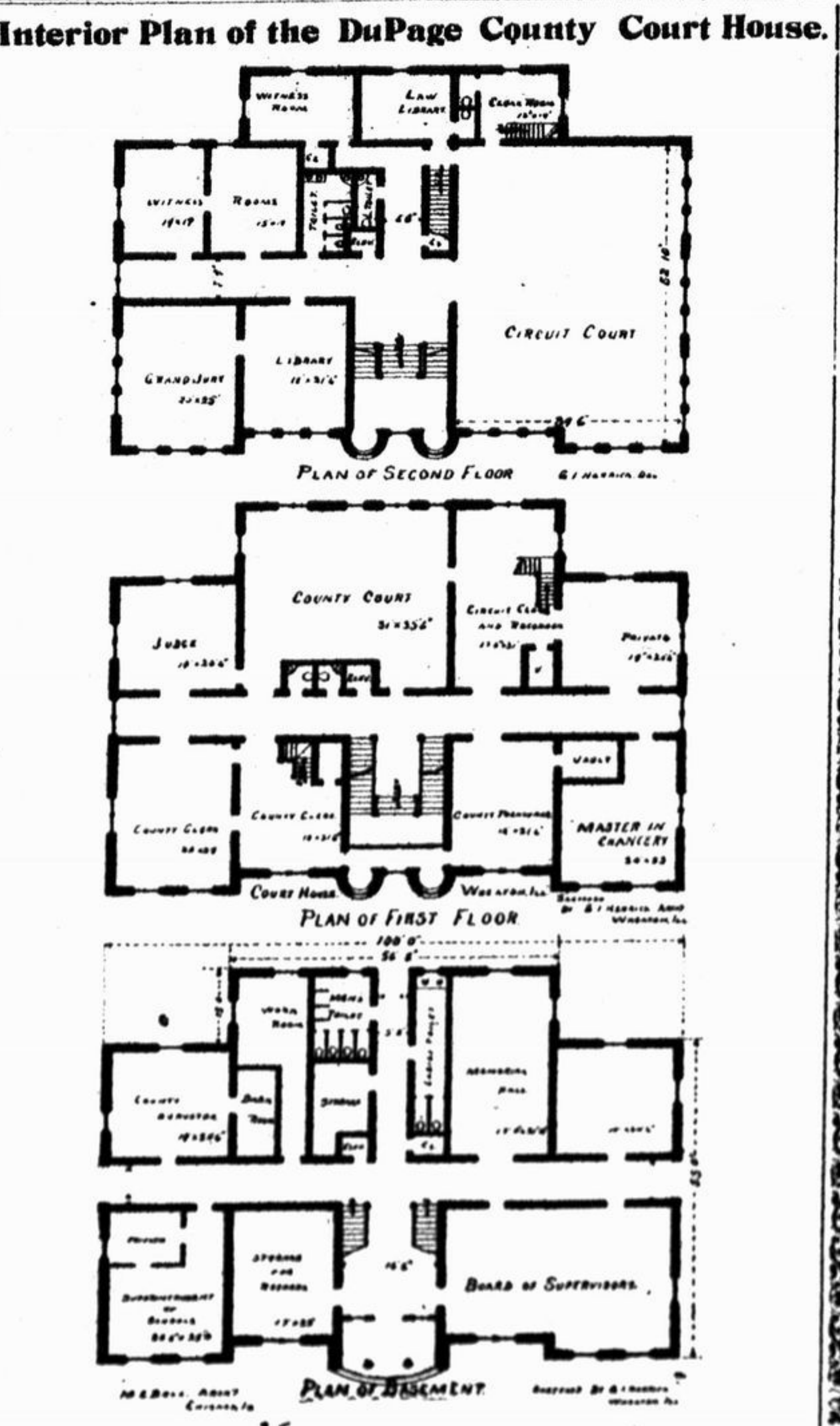

 house in the city of Wheaton, October 30,
 1896. All members of the board present.

 All bills and communications on file
 were read and referred to the proper com-
 mittee.
 Upon motion of Supervisor Chandler,
 Superintendent Morgan was allowed to
 use the county court room.
 Moved by Supervisor Hammerschmidt
 that the board allow \$50 to Jas. H. Mc-
 Carthy and Thomas J. Howard for capture
 horse thieves, also allow \$50 to John Kel-
 ly and Wm. K. Kesselburg for capture of
 Lombard thieves. Carried.
 Upon motion of Supervisor Ham-
 merschmidt the salary of circuit clerk was re-
 ferred to committee on fees and salaries.
 Upon motion of Supervisor Ham-
 merschmidt all district having registered 300
 or more shall be furnished with larger
 ballot boxes.
 Upon motion of Supervisor McClintock
 eleven more large ballot boxes were order-
 ed.
