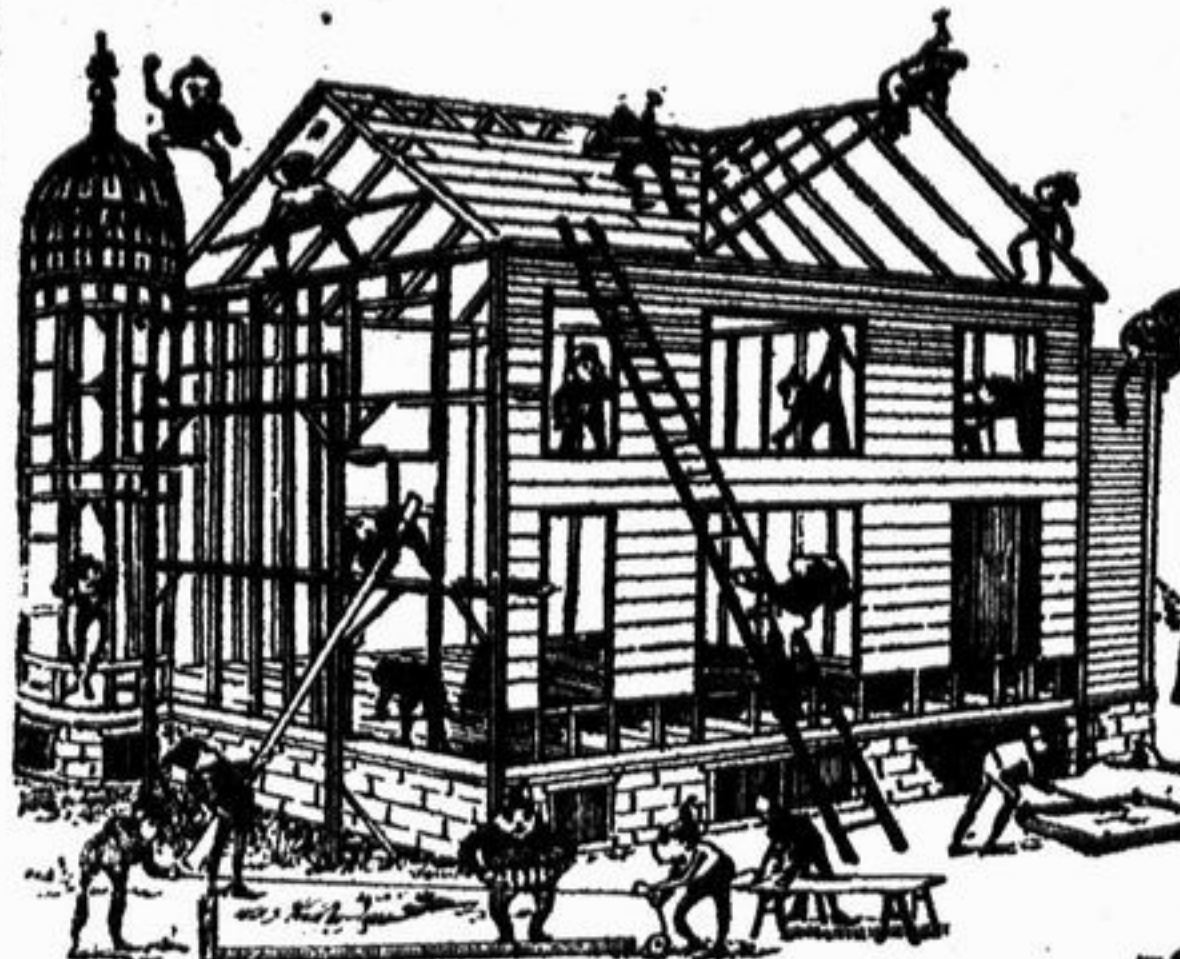

**HINSDALE.**  
Strange as it may seem the cost of the residence and other buildings erected in Hinsdale this year will exceed one hundred thousand dollars. This is a great increase over last year's building and local contractors claim that more will be done here next year in the building line than there has been for three years.

Gen. T. S. Clarkson Commander-in-Chief of the G. A. R., has appointed his old comrade, our fellow townsman, C. B. Kimball, as aid-de-camp on his staff. Gen. Clarkson passed through the city Tuesday on his way east, on a tour of inspection, and was given a reception and lunch at the Great Northern, by the members of his staff in this department.

On Wednesday evening, Mr. and Mrs. Hubert D. Wylie entertained from eight o'clock until twelve in celebration of the twentieth anniversary of their wedding. Over one hundred and fifty guests were present, among whom were many from a distance. The parlors and dining hall were pretty with artistic decorations by Bassett. Palms, ferns, American Beauties and carnations were placed in every nook and corner. In the reception room was an original decoration of American and British flags, representing the two branches of the family.

A reception was given in honor of Grand Outer Guard Cushing, by the Junata lodge, Knights of Pythias, on Wednesday evening. The number present was large and a delightful program was carried out to perfection. Master of ceremonies Snow introduced each speaker with a few happy remarks, the first of whom was Mr. Ephraim of Fidelity lodge Chicago. He told how Mr. Cushing was tendered the high office without any solicitation on his part, of his popularity and his untiring work in the order. Another brief address was made by a brother knight from Chicago, in congratulation of Mr. Cushing.

Finally there is an indication that the Suburban Electric railroad will become an operating line instead of an enterprise wholly on paper. President Cooper is now in New York City negotiating for the needed loans required to complete the work. Since the failure of the Hearst estate to carry out arrangements financing the company's affairs the enterprise has practically been at a stand still. The New York loan was secured several months ago pending McKinley's election. The Suburban Electric began operating cars over the leased line of the Northern Pacific Sunday and will run to LaGrange as soon as the road is completed to that place. A person well informed on the affairs of the company said that he doubted if the road would be extended to Hinsdale for a year to come.
