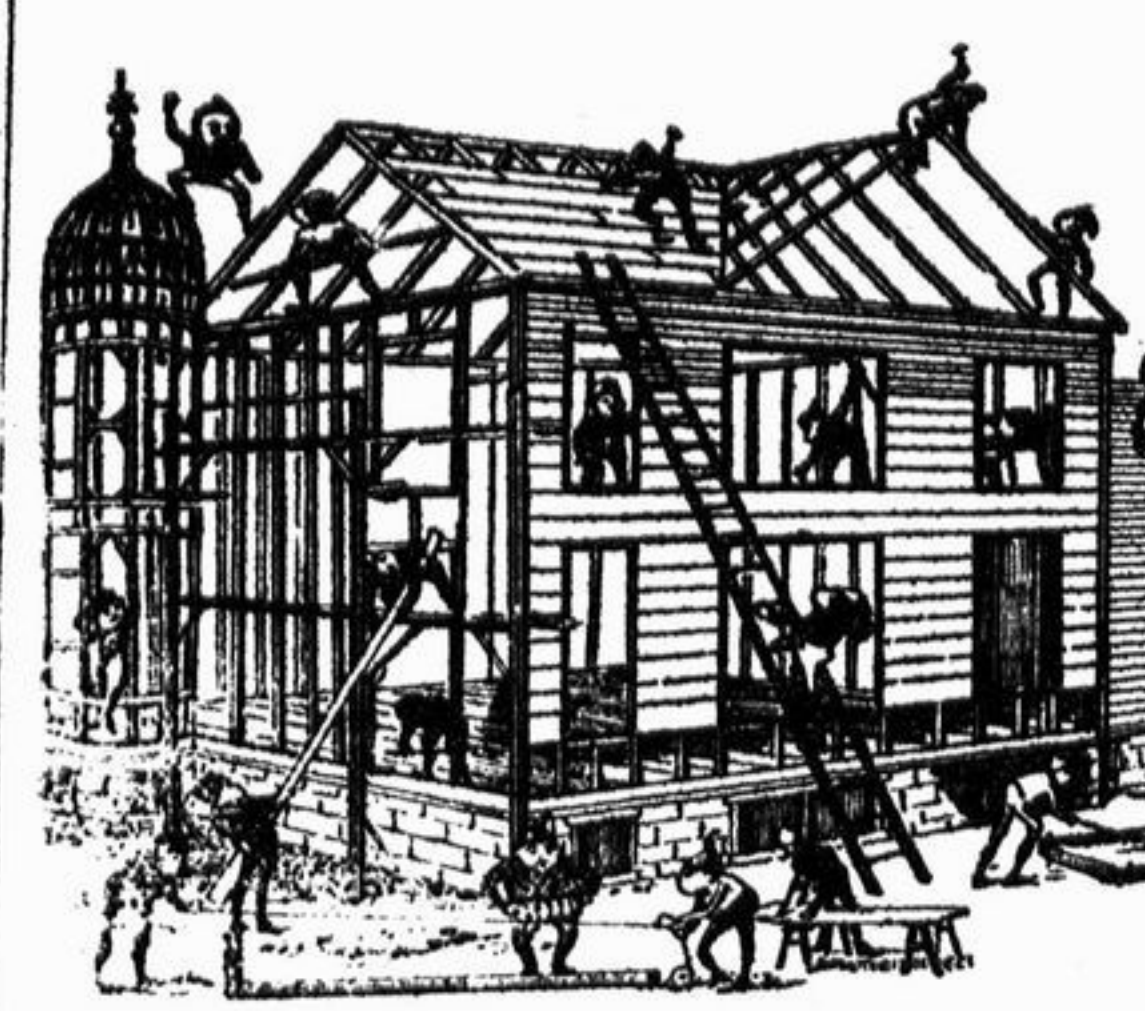

VILLAGE BOARD PROCEEDINGS.
 Continued from the fifth page.
 Surrender of the annexed interest coupons, as they severally mature. Both principal and interest payable at the First National Bank of Chicago, and the prompt payment of this bond and interest, the full faith credit and resources of the said village of Downers Grove are hereby irrevocably pledged.
 This bond is one of a series of three bonds of like tenor and date and is issued by the said village of Downers Grove for the purpose of providing funds for the improvement of the water works system of said village, in accordance with an ordinance of said village, passed and in force January nineteenth, A. D. 1897; and in accordance with the laws of the state of Illinois.
 It is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required to be done precedent to, and in the issuing of these bonds, have been properly done, happened and performed, as required by law; and that the total indebtedness of said village of Downers Grove, including this issue, does not exceed the constitutional and statutory limitation.

Section 2. That such bonds shall be sold at such times and at such rates as the President and Board of Trustees of said village may determine for the best interest of said village, and the proceeds of the same shall be applied to the payment of the cost of pumping apparatus, known as an air compressor, for use of the water works pumping station in said village.
 Section 3. That an annual tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds, as the same mature and become due and payable according to the terms thereof, is hereby levied on all taxable property of said village of Downers Grove, and included in the annual appropriation ordinance to be adopted by the President and Trustees of said Village, and shall be included in the ordinance levying the taxes in said village, which said appropriations and said levy shall be duly certified to the clerk of the county court of said county of DuPage, as required by law until the whole of said bonds with said interest shall be fully paid.
 Section 4. That the credit of said village of Downers, and its revenues be and the same are irrevocably pledged to the payment of each of said bonds and the interest thereon, as provided in the ordinance.
 Section 5. This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage.

 On motion of Trustee Mochel the ordinance as read was placed on its passage.
 The president ordered the roll called on the question, and the ordinance, as read, was then passed by the following vote: Yeas, A. H. Wetton, E. Schultz, Chas. Mochel, J. W. Hughes, G. H. Bunge; Total 5; nays, none.
 The president thereupon declared the ordinance passed and the same was by him approved in open meeting.
 On motion of Trustee Bunge the bid of the First National Bank of Chicago made through Mr. Nussler to purchase said bonds at par upon the payment of a commission to it of \$500.00, was accepted by the following vote: Yeas, Trustees Wetton, Schultz, Mochel, Hughes and Bunge; total 5; nays none.
 On motion of Trustee Schultz the meeting adjourned.
