HOT WAR ON THE CIGARETTE.

The deadly cigarette is making a fight for its life in the legislatures of twenty-seven different states. In several of these states the earnest persuasiveness of women's clubs and other moral and civilizing agencies will count for little against the seductive beguilements of the tobacco trust.

The measures that have been introduced in the various legislative bodies embody two plans for minimizing the evils of the baleful cigarette. These are bills providing for the imposition of such a high license on the business of making and selling cigarettes as to result in practical prohibition, and bills which forbid the manufacture and sale of cigarettes in the respective states.

TO REPEAL THE FLAG LAW.

Bills which have been introduced at this session indicate that a strong effort will be made to repeal the law enacted by the Thirty-ninth general assembly requiring that flags be floated from the schools and public buildings of the state.

According to the figures obtained from records in the office of the state superintendent of public instruction, there are 16,692 public, and 2,619 private and parochial schools in the state, a total of 19,311.

The state superintendent of public instruction has written a letter to the school board at Yorkville which is of general interest. The directors asked whether they might borrow money to pay the salaries of the teachers and be repaid as follows: "The school law makes no provision by which school directors or trustees are empowered with the right to borrow money to pay teachers' salaries."

One of Major McKinley's friends, who has just returned from Canton, brings with him the following authentic list of the McKinley cabinet as it has been finally decided upon: Secretary of State, John Sherman, of Ohio; Secretary of the Treasury, Lyman J. Gage, of Illinois; Secretary of War, Russell A. Alger, of Michigan; Secretary of the Navy, John D. Long, of Massachusetts; Attorney General, Joseph McKenna, of California; Secretary of the Interior, J. J. McCook, of New York; Postmaster General, James A. Gary, of Maryland; Secretary of Agriculture, James Wilson, of Iowa.

The experiments in rural free mail delivery have proceeded far enough to show that postmasters at the offices concerned are in favor of the system, while the rural beneficiaries are greatly pleased with it. While the postmasters at every one of the forty-four offices where rural delivery has been introduced have made a favorable report, Postmaster General Wilson has not yet prepared his report; but a Washington dispatch says it is believed he will demonstrate the value of continuance of the experiment for one year.

A bill has been introduced by Senator Jones in the general assembly, which is intended to put a stop to "deadhead" in the state institutions, is being considered by the judiciary committee and will probably be reported favorably. The measure, Senator Evans estimates, will cost the state nearly \$1,000 annually to run "deadhead boarders" at state prisons, insane hospitals and public institutions. Should this bill pass, it will put a stop to this
