**FREE TEXT-BOOKS WOULD COST LITTLE**  
It is very little the Illinois State Teachers' association asks when it asks for the free text-book law. The proposed law would be permissive, not compulsory. School directors and boards of education, while they would be empowered to adopt the plan in their districts, towns or cities, would not be compelled to, and if they did, they would not be authorized to increase the school tax beyond the point now fixed by law.  
The cost of the books themselves would be very slight. The average retail price of text-books in a representative Illinois county has been found on investigation to be 40 per cent above the price at which school boards can now buy them from the publishers. This means an enormous saving in first cost, and the books can be used at least twice over.  
As for the rest of the community, the tax would be infinitesimal, even if it were laid in excess of the school tax, which the proposed statute does not contemplate. The average cost for books in the grades below the high school, at retail prices, is about \$2 a year, including stationary and drawing materials. Purchased in wholesale quantities by contract with the publishers, the cost would be less. During nine years in which the compulsory free text-book law was in operation in Massachusetts the average annual cost per pupil was \$1.63, and this was for books in all grades, including high schools and normal schools.  
Again, the bill distinctly provides that no child shall be compelled to use a free text-book, if its parent or guardian wishes it to have one of its own.  
So it is little that is asked by the friends of the free text-book movement, and they are asking that little not in aid of private interests, but to enable poor children to get educations, to make the most of themselves, to become intelligent Americans capable of exercising the functions of citizenship in the greatest republic on earth. They are asking it for the good of society. They are asking that the school system that is almost complete be completed by this addition to what has already been done, an addition which can be made with almost no effort on the part of the taxpayer, but which means so much to that very part of the community which most needs education and enlightenment.  
Nineteen states have the system which is proposed for Illinois. In ten of these the law is even more radical, for it compels school boards to furnish free books. Not one of these states has reversed its action or shown any willingness to have its school system return to the comparatively undeveloped condition of the present system of this state. It is time for Illinois to join the ranks of those states which have demonstrated by experience that their course is beneficial and right.—Chicago Journal.
