The following report of the grand jury was read and upon motion of Supervisor Fischer ordered to be spread upon the records. Carried.
REPORT OF GRAND JURY.
March term 1897, DuPage county circuit court. The Honorable Judge Clark W. Upton, judge of the circuit court.
We, the grand jury for the March term of said circuit court, desire to hereby make the following report:
We have given consideration to all matters and things brought to our notice and have returned your honorable court twelve presentments and two no presentments found.
We have visited the county jail and find the same well and cleanly kept.
Whereas the present board of supervisors have acted wisely and with discretion in the building of the court house, they are entitled to receive the approval and thanks of the people of DuPage county and while each member of the board is entitled to the fullest commendation, we feel we shall fail to do justice to a faithful public servant if we do not make a special mention of the member of the board who has been assistant superintendent of construction, Charles B. Blodgett, and of the skillful, vigilant and conscientious manner in which he has guarded the county's interests in every detail.
We visited the county farm and can speak with entire approval of the manner in which it is conducted by the superintendent and especially do we approve of the care of the house and the inmates shown as being taken by the superintendent and his wife. We examined the accounts and find the institution self supporting.
We would recommend for the present, that the oil lamps for use of the inmates be attached to the building so they shall not be movable and that candles be provided for portable use. We find the sanitary and fire appliances good and water supply adequate. We would recommend that for a brief period daily instructions as to the use of fire hose and instructions as to the assistance of helpless inmates be given to such inmates as would be able to assist in case of fire and that hereafter instructions be given at regular intervals to the end no loss of life in event of fire may occur.
We recommend that the board of supervisors appropriate the sum of \$100.00 or such other sum as shall be deemed necessary, not exceeding \$100.00 to be at the disposal of the states attorney for use only in payment by him at his discretion of actual expenses of witnesses while in attendance upon the grand jury or in criminal cases while in attendance at court. We acknowledge our great indebtedness to the states attorney, sheriff and deputies for courtesies shown and assistance rendered during our labors. Respectfully submitted.
