

SUPERVISOR'S PROCEEDINGS.

A special meeting of the Board of
Supervisors held in the court rooms at
Wheaton on April 30th, pursuant to
adjournment of last meeting.

Meeting was called to order by Supervisor Bartlett, chairman. Roll was
called and all members present. The
proceedings of last meeting were read
and approved as corrected.

All bills and communications on file
were read and referred to proper com-
mittees.

The committee on poor farm, having
drafted a set of rules to govern the
management of same for the ensuing
year, presented them to the full board
for consideration. After discussing
them section by section, on motion of
Supervisor Barnard they were accept-
ed and adopted.

Moved by Supervisor Hull that copy
of rules on poor farm be in pamphlet
form, and that rules to be formulated
by the chair governing procedure of
Board, be included in same. Carried.

Moved and seconded that board ad-
journ until 1:30 p.m. Carried.

Report of committee on fees and salaries
was read as follows:

Board of Supervisors:

Your committee on fees and salaries
would beg leave to report that they have
examined all claims presented
to them, and recommend the payment
of the following, and that the clerk be
directed to issue orders for the several
amounts to the several claimants

H. C. Hoy, as per bill of April 29, \$12.50

All of which is respectfully submit-

An motion report was accepted as
read.

Report of committee on claims was
presented as follows:

Your committee on claims would

C. B. Blodgett, ass't sup't April, \$10.00
Herman Meek, Holidays, \$3.00
C. H. Hoy, as per bill, \$15.50
Jacob Fox, janitor services, \$2.00
Geo. Estefelder, clothes for prisoners, \$2.20

The bill of H. F. Lawrence for extra
clerk hire is referred to the full board.

All of which is respectfully submit-
ted. I. N. MURRAY, Chairman.

Moved by Supervisor Hull that re-
port be accepted as read. Carried.

Moved by Supervisor Barnard that
chair be appointed as a committee of
one to visit the asylum at Elgin to see
what arrangements could be made
as to the care of the insane of this
county and the return of patient dis-
charged as harmless and incurable.
Carried.

Moved by Supervisor McClinton
that bill of H. F. Lawrence for extra
clerk hire be allowed. Carried.

Moved by Supervisor Hammer-
schmidt that the board approve of the
states attorney's action in filing peti-
tion in county court for commitment of
Brinkman to girl's industrial school.
Carried.

Report of assessors of the different
towns was presented and on motion of
Supervisor Fischer was approved as
read.

Report of the board of assessors of
DuPage county to the board of super-
visors of DuPage county, made April
30th, 1897:

Horses, \$10; cows, \$6; gold watches,

\$5; silver watches, \$5; sewing machines,

\$5; hogs, \$1; sheep, \$1; all other per-
sonal property one-sixth value; farm
lands one-sixth value; town lots one-
sixth value.

We understand that in the town of
Winfield the tax or license on dogs
was not collected in full. We recom-
mend that the license on dogs be col-
lected as provided by law.

We would recommend to this board
of supervisors that steps be taken by
your honorable body to prevent ex-
cessive levies of taxes, that is levies
above the statutory limit.

Moved by Supervisor McClinton that
assessors be allowed per diem for meet-
ing with the board. Carried.

Moved by Supervisor Barnard that
the county treasurer be instructed to
use his best endeavors to collect the
delinquent dog tax from the collectors
of the different townships. Carried.

Moved by Supervisor Isherwood that
the several amounts due from the
county officers as agreed upon by
finance committee after checking up
same, be paid to county treasurer. Carried.

On motion of Supervisor Barnard the
board adjourned at call of chair.
