Secretary Gage is preparing a financial measure, to be submitted to congress next winter. In pursuance of this plan he has sent out a letter to 200 leading bankers and merchants, inviting suggestions for placing the currency upon a "sound" basis.

Lady Henry Somerset has been re-elected president of the British Women's Temperance association for the eighth time.

Big Fire at Alexandria.

Fire at Alexandria, Va., Thursday caused a total damage of from \$450,000 to \$500,000, partly insured. The entire block bounded by the Strand, Union, Duke and Prince streets was laid in ruins.

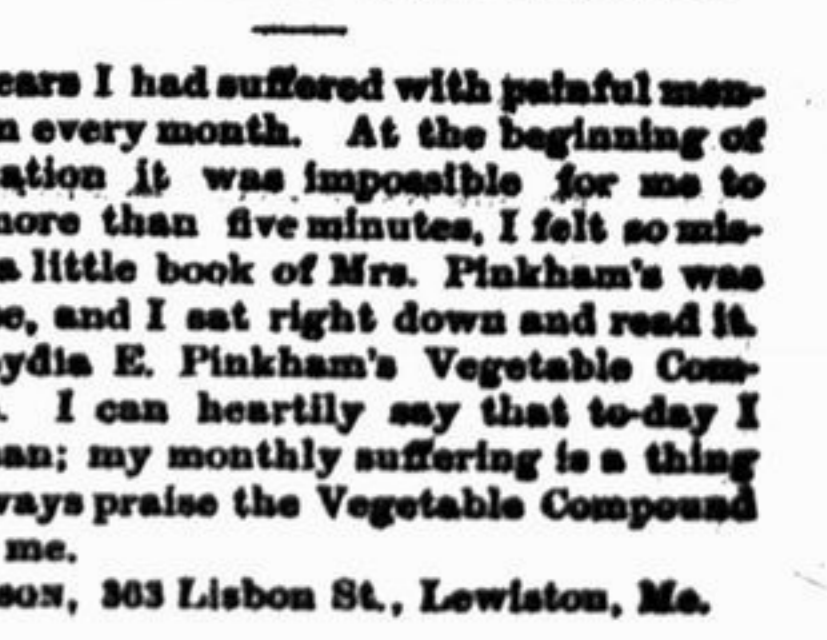
