NEW SPECIAL ASSESSMENT LAW.

A thorough revolution in the business of levying special assessments will result from the new law signed by Gov. Tanner last Saturday.

The chief difference will be that city councils and village trustees will have nothing to do with starting special assessment work.

The law creates a commission which in village like Downers consists of the Attorney, Engineer and Chairman of the Street Committee, which originates all improvements and decides whether they are needed.

Petitions for improvements are to be submitted to this board, whose members decide whether they are needed. The board may also originate ordinances for improvements without petition.

The majority of frontage consents must be obtained from the property owners before improvements are made except in cases of public necessity.

Among other things which it is claimed the law will do are the following:

It requires personal notice of every proposed improvement to be given to every interested property owner, and give him a hearing before the board before any scheme is adopted or expense incurred.

It requires that the work of spreading the assessment shall be done by special officers.

It does away with rebates by requiring the excess to be at once ascertained and credited on the assessment.

It requires a thorough and careful search for the owners of record of property and makes the most ample provision for their having notice of assessment.

It leaves full authority with the court to control, revise, recast, or annul the assessments as the justice and right of each case may require.

It gives the fullest chance to every person assessed to have his hearing in court.

It requires the fullest competition in bidding for work, but guarantees good faith and fairness on the part of the contractor by providing that that the property owners may, after the bids are taken in the contract themselves if they will do so at 10% above the lowest bid.

It allows no more than 6% of the amount of the assessment to pay the expenses of the office.

WEATHER AND CROP BULLETIN.

The temperature of the week averaged from 4 to 7 degrees above normal, and several hot days were experienced. Rain came in thunder showers and ranged from light sprinkles in west and southwest counties to several times normal in north and east, being heaviest in south LaSalle and south Kendall. Corn has made excellent growth, but the stand is very uneven; oats are heading short and not promising; winter wheat and rye are being harvested in the southern section; clover cutting is well begun, with a good crop well saved; gardens and potatoes are generally needing rain in the drier counties. Fruits are excellent, raspberries, cherries and dew berries plentiful on the markets, blackberries and early peaches ripening.

Northern section: The temperature in the northern section averaged from 5 to 7 degrees daily above normal, except in the northeast counties, where it fell off to 1 degree above; rainfall ran from a quarter of an inch to about four inches in south LaSalle, Grundy and south Kendall. The heavy rains and warm weather caused marked improvement everywhere; corn has grown rapidly; oats, grasses, gardens and potatoes are much improved; clover being cut, with fair yield, timothy will be light. Oats are heading rather short; rye fair; wheat not much benefitted. Cherries are coming to market; strawberries nearly exhausted.
