scription should read: "The east half of said township excepting the west 80 rods of sections No. 10 and 15. Therefore be it Resolved, that the records of said proceedings be so amended as to except from said east half of said township of Milton the west 80 rods of sections 10 and 15 of said town and that said part of sections 10 and 15 of said town, lying north of the Chicago & Northwestern railway, be attached to and be a part of precinct No. 3 and that part of said section 15, lying south of said railway, be attached to and made a part of precinct No. 1 of said town of Milton, and that John Christie, George Hageman, and W. L. Wheaton be the judges of precinct No. 1 and Philo W. Stacy, W. B. Lloyd and W. C. Newton, judges of precinct No. 2, and Wm. H. Johnson, James Congleton and the supervisor, judges of precinct No. 3.

Moved by Supervisor Barnard that the communication of W. J. Catlin be laid on the table and filed with others of similar kind. Carried.

Moved by Supervisor Hammerschmidt that the Elmhurst Electric Light and Power company be granted permission to erect a pole line on the St. Charles road from the electric plant to the village of Elmhurst. Carried.

Moved by Supervisor Hammerschmidt that superintendent of poor farm be instructed to receive any insane patient when presented by sheriff and await a written order from the proper supervisor. Carried.

Moved by Supervisor Barnard that the superintendent of the county poor farm on receiving a patient that has been returned from the insane asylum shall notify the supervisor of the town from which the patient came, and that it shall be the duty of the said supervisor to bring the matter to the attention of the county judge and be governed by his order. Carried.

On motion the meeting adjourned to 1:30 o'clock p. m.

Resolved, that the several county officers having an office at the county seat, be and they are hereby authorized and instructed to take possession of their respective offices in the new court house immediately following the dedication thereof, and that they are severally requested as soon as possible following said date to remove to their respective offices the effects pertaining thereto, and to thereafter at proper hours, keep said offices open for transaction of official business.
