Proceedings Village Board. Downers Grove, Aug. 23, 1897.

The adjourned meeting from August 16th, was called to order by President Bush.

Mr. Hogeland of the Globe Light & Heat Co., being present stated that he would like to have the village renew their contract for street lighting.

After some discussion Mr. Hogeland was asked to burn six lamps every night and all night, to which he agreed.

It was regularly moved, seconded and carried that the village enter into contract with the Globe Light & Heat Co. to furnish light for street lighting at price named by Mr. Hogeland.

President Bush stated there was a new device for keeping scale off boilers, etc. Matter was referred to water committee.

President Bush stated there had been several complaints about lake and creek. After some discussion it was moved and carried that the matter of creek lake and cutting grass around lake be referred to improvement committee with power to act.

The matter of signs for street corners was brought up. Action on same was deferred.

The matter of street sprinkling was brought up by President Bush. It was moved and carried that the board resolve to pass at next meeting in relation to street sprinkling and sprinkler connections to resume sprinkling.

President Bush brought up matter of sewer for repairing streets. It was moved and carried that the street committee be empowered to

use gravel or crushed stone as they see fit in improving streets. The matter of electric light was brought up. Mr. Heckman being present, presented and had read an additional proposition to petition for ordinance.

Upon motion matter was referred to ordinance committee to confer with company and report at next meeting. Upon motion board adjourned.

Downers Grove, Sept. 6, 1897. The regular monthly meeting for the month of September was called to order by President Bush.

Roll call noted present Trustees Barr, Mochel, Hughes, Mayer, Schultz and Root.

The minutes of last regular and adjourned meetings were read and upon motion ordered placed on file.

No report was received from the superintendent of waterworks. Claim ordinance No. 57, providing for the payment of the following claims, was then passed:

P. C. Gallup being present stated that he could furnish village one car of coal at \$2.00 per ton. It was moved and carried that water committee be instructed to buy a car load of coal of Hughes & Gallup for \$2.00 per ton, same to be Seaton egg to be delivered in one week.

Trustee Schultz of the finance committee reported the withdrawal of the resignation of Village Treasurer Rogers. Upon motion board adjourned to meet Monday evening, Sept. 13, 1897.

Downers Grove, Sept. 13, 1897. The adjourned regular meeting from Sept. 6th, 1897, to Sept. 13th, 1898, was called to order by President Bush.

Roll call noted present Trustees Root, Barr, Hughes and Mochel. Absent Trustees Schultz and Mayer.

Health Officer Dixon reported several complaints in regard to creek and recommended flushing of same. It was moved and carried that matter be referred to water committee with power to act.

Petitions were read from R. W. Bond asking permission to tap water mains on Curtiss street in front of LaSalle property, to carry pipe across said property to his house on Railroad street.

It was moved that the clerk write H. D. Judson calling attention to matter of building storm shed at the depot as agreed by the railroad people when they should build a new platform at said place.
