### JUSTICE FIELD.

Justice Field of the Supreme Court of the United States has resigned. He has been on the supreme bench longer than any other justice, having served five years in the state of California, previous to his appointment in 1863 by President Lincoln to the United States bench. During his incumbency, three chief justices and sixteen associate justices have passed away. He entered upon his duties in the midst of the Civil war, and had a very prominent part in the decisions that came up in the great reconstruction period which followed. No more difficult or momentous questions were ever presented to any court in the world, and no court decisions have proven to be more correct and wise, and been accepted as such by the universal judgment of the people. It has been one of the great glories of this republic that the people have accepted the decisions of the Supreme Court—the final authority of the land. It has been the greatest proof that the people of America are capable of self-government. It is true that there has been one or two decisions of the court that have not met with popular approval by the whole people, notably the Dred Scott decision, but the people did not try to abolish the court because of this. Dangerous characters and ignorant men have railed against the Supreme Court, but the great mass of the people have perfect confidence in its rulings.

### SIDEWALK ORDINANCE NO. 25.

An ordinance providing for the construction of a sidewalk on the north side of Grove street, in front of lots 50, 49, 48, 84 and that of lot 85 abutting on Grove street of assessor's survey of section 7 and 8 in township 38, range 11, village of Downers Grove, DuPage county, Illinois. Be it ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Downers Grove in the County of DuPage and State of Illinois:

Sec. 1. That a sidewalk be constructed on the north side of Grove street, and immediately in front of the following lots and lands, to-wit: 50, 49, 48, 84, and that of lot 85 abutting on Grove street of assessor's survey of sections 7 and 8 in township 38, range 11, village of Downers Grove, DuPage county, state of Illinois.

Sec. 2. That the whole cost of said walk shall be levied upon said lots and lands in proportion to their frontage upon said sidewalk.

Sec. 3. Said sidewalk shall be constructed under the supervision and to the acceptance of the street commissioner of said village, and the same shall be of the width and constructed of the materials and in the manner as follows, to-wit: Said walk shall be 4 feet and 8 inches in width and constructed of the best number one common pine lumber. The planks shall be laid crosswise and be not less than 2 inches in thickness, nor less than 6 inches or more than 10 inches in width, same to be supported by and securely nailed with wire nails (twenty penny) to three pine stringers not less than 2 by 6 inches, securely bound together at the joints. Said stringers to rest on flat stone blocking or cedar posts.

Sec. 4. That the owners of the said lots and parcels of land are hereby required to construct said sidewalk in front of their respective lots, agreeably to the provisions of Section 3 of this ordinance, within thirty days after the publication thereof.

Sec. 5. Upon the default of any owner or owners to construct that part of said walk immediately in front of his or their respective lot or lots within thirty days after the publication of this ordinance, it shall be the duty of the said street commissioner to cause the same to be constructed in behalf of said village at the cost of said owner or owners. The said street commissioner shall certify to a bill of the cost of said walk constructed by the village in front of said lots, showing in separate items the cost of grading, materials, laying down and supervision, and file it in the office of the village clerk, together with a list of the lots or parcels of land touching upon the line of said sidewalk, the names of the owners thereof and the frontage of their respective lots on said sidewalk.

See. 6. The village collector is hereby designated as the officer to collect the special tax herein provided, and to whom warrants for the same shall be directed.

Sec. 7. The village clerk shall in all respects comply with the provisions of an act of the general assembly of the state of Illinois, entitled "An act to provide additional means for the construction of sidewalks in cities, towns and villages," in force in the state of Illinois, July 1st, A. D. 1875.

Upon failure of the collector to collect said special tax pursuant to the provisions of said act, it shall be the duty of said clerk to make a report of such special tax in writing to the county treasurer and ex-officio collector on or before the 31st day of March, A. D. 1898, as required by said act.

An ordinance providing for the construction of a sidewalk on north side of Maple avenue in front of lot 11, assessor's survey section 7 and 8, township 38, range 11, village of Downers Grove, DuPage county, state of Illinois:

Be it ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the village of Downers Grove, in the county of DuPage and state of Illinois:

Section 1. That a sidewalk be constructed on north side of Maple avenue, and immediately in front of the following lots and lands, to-wit: Lot 11 of assessor's survey, section 7 and 8, township 38, range 11, village of Downers Grove, DuPage county, state of Illinois.

Sec. 2. That the whole cost of said walk shall be levied upon said lots and lands in proportion to their frontage upon said sidewalk.

Sec. 3.
