Friends of Joseph R. Dunlop have renewed their efforts to secure a pardon for the former Chicago publisher now at Joliet penitentiary. A long petition for pardon was received a few days ago and referred to the attorney-general.

Increase in Kansas Bank Deposits. The increase in deposits of Kansas banks for the year amount to \$7,000,000. This is an increase over last year of 145 per cent.

Wants Missionaries Recalled. The sultan of Turkey has demanded the recall of the two American missionaries from the province of Aleppo on the pretext that their mission for the distribution of relief is likely to cause disturbances.

Monetary Commission Adjourns. The monetary commission has adjourned till November 2. It is understood that a practical agreement has been reached as to the general outlines of a plan for a reform in the currency.

COULD NOT AGREE.

Judge Tutill Discharges the Jury in the Luettger Case.

For sixty-six hours the jury struggled with the Luettger murder case at Chicago. They retired shortly before 5 o'clock Monday afternoon.

The final ballot taken by the jury resulted 9 to 3 for conviction.

In the presence of his attorneys Luettger made a sworn statement in which he denied his guilt.

The jurors signed the following statement: "We wish to state that while the evidence was such that we were unable to agree upon a verdict, one thing we did agree about, and that is, that the circumstances were such that the people had ample reason to prosecute on the showing without hearing the de-
