VILLAGE BOARD PROCEEDINGS.

Downers Grove, Ill., Oct. 18, 1897. The board met in special session called by order of President Bush for the purpose of considering the following subjects mentioned in call, said call being on file in the village clerk's office.

- I. To receive report of health commissioner and constable.
- 2. To receive report of health commissioner on drains and diphtheria cases.
- 3. To consider resolution to allow John Oldfield to construct an 8-foot concrete walk from Main street to east line of his building on south side of Curtiss street, 4. To receive recommendations of local
- board of improvements. 5. To pass an ordinance for construction of a sidewalk on north side of Grove
- street from Main to Carpenter street. 6. To transact such other urgent business as may be brought before the meet-

dent Bush. Koll call noted present Trustees Barr, Root, Mayer, Mochel, Schultz. Absent Trustee Hughes.

The bond of George Hoffert as health sum of \$2,000, with Levi Mertz and J. W. Rogers as sureties, was read. It was moved by Trustee Root, seconded by Trustee Barr, that said bond be accepted and approved. Motion carried, all voting aye.

The health commissioner reported the diphtheria case as fully recovered and premises thoroughly famigated and quarantine restrictions removed.

The health commissioner also reported outlet of north side sewer drain as being in a very unsanitary condition. The commissioner was instructed to use his best endeavors to locate the source of said drainage.

At this juncture of proceedings Trustee Hughes arrived and took his seat.

Trustee Root then offered the following resolution:

Resolved, that John Oldfield be, and he hereby is authorized and licensed to construct a stone or cement sidewalk on Curtiss street in the village of Downers Grove, immediately adjoining on the north the three-story brick building recently constructed by said Oldfield upon property owned by him. Said sidewalk to extend from Main street easterly to the eastern boundary of said building, and to adjoin said building on the south, and the northern boundary thereof not to exceed eight (8) feet from the south line of Curtise

Said sidewalk shall be constructed or stone or cement and under the supervision of the committee on streets and to their acceptance; provided that the permission and license berein granted to said Oldfield to construct a sidewalk eight (%) feet wide as hereinbefore provided, shall in nowise be construed as indicating a purpose on the part of the board of trustees to require other property owners on said street to construct a similar walk. Said permission being granted only at the request of said Oldfield and in consideration of the fact that said walk is in keeping with the character of the building constructed upon the said adjoining property.

Trustee Morhel introduced a petition from property owners on Cartiss street praying such permission be not granted, but that the said Oldfield only be permitted to construct a walk of the width provided for in the village ordinances.

After considerable discussion it was moved by Trustee Root, seconded by Trustee Barr, that resolution be put upon its passage. Carried.

Said resolution was then put upon its passage and carried; those voting are were Trustees Barr, Root, Mayer, Hughes, Schultz; total 5. Nays, Trustee Mochel;

Sidewalk ordinance No. 25, providing for the construction of a sidewalk on the north side of Grove street from Main to Carpenter streets, in front of lots 50, 49, 48, 84, and that part of lot 85 abutting on Grove street, of assessor's survey of section 7 and 8, in township 38, range 11, was then read.

It was moved and carried that said sidewalk ordinance No. 25 be put upon its

Said ordinance was then put upon its passage and carried; those voting aye were Trustees Barr, Mayer, Mochel, Root, Hughes and Schultz.

Sidewalk ordinance No. 26 providing for the construction of a sidewalk on the north side of Maple avenue, in front of lot 11 of assessor's survey of sections 7 and 8, township 38, range 11, was then read. It was moved and earried that said sidewalk ordinance No. 26 be put upon its

Said ordinance was then put upon its passage and carried; those voting are were Trustees Schultz, Mochel, Hughes, Mayer,

Sidewalk ordinance No. 27 providing for the construction of a sidewalk on the east side of North Main street, in front of lots 8 to 14, both inclusive, block 6, and lots 13 to 24, both inclusive, block 17, E. H. Prince & Co. addition, was then read. It was moved and carried that said sidewalk ordinance No. 27 be put upon its

Said ordinance was then put upon its passage and carried; those voting aye were Trustees Root, Mayer, Mochel, Schultz, Hughes and Barr. Upon proper motion board adjourned.


