MINOR EVENTS OF THE WEEK.

Items of General Interest Told in Paragraphs.

COMPLETE NEWS SUMMARY.

Record of Happenings of Much or Little Importance from All Parts of the Civilized World—Prices of Farm Produce in Western Markets.

In a public address in Berlin Herr Decker declared the United States the most patriotic country in the world. He favored the Nicaragua canal project, and said that England should make concessions.

King Menelik of Abyssinia may take advantage of England's war in the Transvaal to make an effort to extend his territory in North Africa.

Forty-one merchant tailoring firms in Chicago have signed an agreement to fight to a finish the demands of the journeymen.

Passage of the financial bill, it is believed, may remove that question from politics, as the present gold-standard majority in the senate will retain control until at least 1906, blocking any attempt to secure free coinage of silver.

Although President McKinley favors free trade with Puerto Rico, he will not antagonize the bill fixing a tariff on imports from that island.

An amendment to the financial bill providing for an international bimetallic commission was defeated in the senate by 45 to 25.

Protests by the farmers in France may defeat the ratification of the Franco-American commercial treaty.

Dr. Max Sering, in a public address in Berlin, urges a European Zollverein to prevent the crushing of Germany by other powers.

Judge Taft has decided that the Federal court has no jurisdiction in the Kentucky contest, and W. S. Taylor must rely on state courts to retain the governorship.

The anti-trust conference adjourned Wednesday after a stormy session, caused by the desire of middle-of-the-road populists for political action.

Trinity Methodist church, Chicago, was burned Wednesday night, with a loss of \$100,000, the alarm of fire interrupting a prayer meeting.

Dealers report the largest trade in Valentines ever known in Chicago.

Chicago coal dealers are discussing the feasibility of shipping coal to Europe.

Chicago city officials plan to issue 2 per cent bonds to take up \$2,200,000 of outstanding judgments drawing 5 or 6 per cent.

The Illinois Central probably will build a line from Mankato to St. Cloud and secure an outlet to Lake Superior at Duluth.

The Illinois railroad and warehouse commission reports for the year ended Jan. 30, 1899, show an increase of \$67,218,205 in railway earnings.

Plans are being considered for placing annual college track meets under faculty control.

M. Waldeck-Rousseau, the French premier, is reported to have notified the pope he is determined to crush the clergy who are opposing his government.

Joe Chrynski was given the decision, over Peter Maher in their six-round go in Chicago Friday night.

Col. W. P. Reid predicts that the price of coal in the east will advance from 25 to 50 per cent April 1.

Pneumatic Tubes for Postal Service.
The pneumatic tube in the postal service has been forcibly endorsed by the action of Postmaster Van Cott of New York, who has asked for money for its extension. All the mail matter going out of the Grand Central station is handled through one of these tubes, and it is estimated that about 800,000 pieces daily pass through this one conduit. The distance is three and one-quarter miles, and the trip is made in seven and one-half minutes. The carriers hold about 300 letters, and they make a total of 2,000 trips per day.

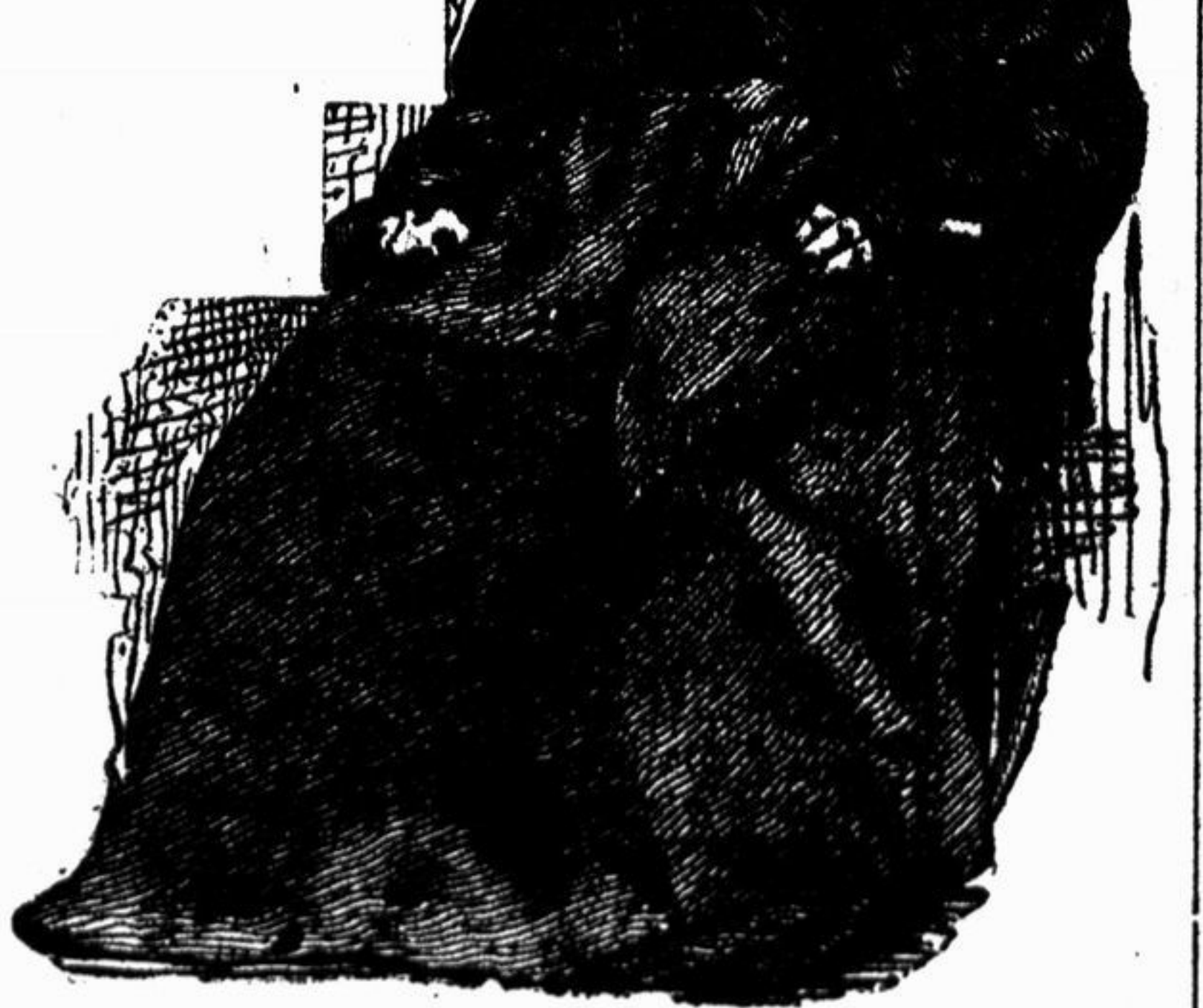
