REPUBLICANS UNITED ON YATES.

The outcome of the republican state convention at Peoria last week was a decided victory for lovers of clean politics. Not for many years had there been such a strong fight for political control as that which dominated the Peoria convention. The defeat of Judge Haney and the machine is due solely to Judge Carter and his friends, who loyally stood by him and voted for clean politics, with the result that Richard Yates was nominated, simply because the Haney following had nowhere else to go. Everywhere are heard expressions of satisfaction with the nomination of Richard Yates for governor, and the sentiment everywhere seems to be that the convention could not have acted more wisely than it did in selecting him as the standard bearer of the party for the coming campaign. Judge Yates is a representative of the best there is in the party, a man of the people and for the people. There is no bitterness in his nomination, and a united and enthusiastic support will be given him in every county in Illinois.

There are no longer Tanner republicans and Callom republicans. All are just plain republicans lining up to meet the common enemy and getting ready to give "Dick" Yates the biggest majority ever bestowed upon a candidate for governor in Illinois.

The resolutions of the convention strike the key note of the situation. They are clear cut and unwavering, and in every instance there rings out fealty to the principles of the party. They are model resolutions and deserve the attention and consideration of every voter in the state.

The new village board has started on its administration in a business-like manner, judging from its outlined policy, the affairs of the village will be transacted on business principles. President Root and each member of the board are earnestly alive to the requirements of the village, and a year of progression in municipal improvements is earnestly to be hoped.

The DuPage county delegation at the republican state convention, while not covering themselves with glory in naming the gubernatorial nominee, nevertheless have the satisfaction of knowing that the county they represented will give Judge Yates and the state ticket the largest proportional majority of any county in the state.

The republican state convention honored the eighth district in the selection of Hale D. Adams, of Aurora, as one of the national convention delegates-at-large. Mr. Adams gave up what was practically a sure thing as district delegate, and as a recognition was given the higher honor.
