OFFICIAL BOARD PROCEEDINGS.

DOWNERS GROVE, ILL., May 7, 1900. The adjourned meeting from April 30th to May 7th was called to order by Clerk White. No quorum being present, the board adjourned.

DOWNERS GROVE, ILL., May 7, 1900. The regular meeting for the month of May, 1900, was called to order by President Gallagher.

Roll call noted present Trustees Hughes, Mechel, Pearnell, Prince and Woelfersheim absent, Trustee Bush.

The minutes of last regular, adjourned and special meetings were then read and approved.

Reports of village treasurer and village collector were read and ordered placed on file.

Claim ordinance No. 91, providing for the payment of certain claims, was read. The following claims were presented:

An ordinance to amend sections 1, 2 and 3 of chapter 19 of an ordinance entitled "An ordinance for revising, amending and consolidating the general ordinances of the village, passed May 3, 1897, and to provide for stone, concrete and vitrified brick sidewalks upon certain streets in the village and specifying the manner in which the sidewalks shall be constructed," was introduced.

It was moved and carried that the ordinance be put upon its passage.

Said ordinance was then put upon its passage and carried. Those voting aye were Trustees Hughes, Mechel, Pearnell, Prince and Woelfersheim. Nays, none.

It was moved and carried that the board adjourn without date.

The new board was called to order by Clerk White. Roll call noted present President Root, Trustees Kuenzel, Pearnell, Waples and Woelfersheim. Absent, Trustee Bush and Bunge.

President-elect Root and Trustees-elect Kuenzel and Waples were then administered the oath of office by Judge D. G. Graham.

President Root then presented the following list of committee appointments: Finance—Pearnell, Bunge and Waples. Improvement—President Root, Bunge, Street and Alley—Woelfersheim, Kuenzel, Pearnell, Water and Light—Bunge, Woelfersheim, Waples. Ordinance—Waples, Woelfersheim, Kuenzel. License—Kuenzel, Pearnell, Bunge.

President Root then offered the following appointments for village officers: Treasurer, J. W. Rogers; collector, V. Sinner; attorney, M. Sinner; postmaster and street commissioner, W. H. Morris; health commissioner, C. F. Davis; assistant health commissioner, Louis Klein; superintendent of water works and power plant, J. D. Parker; health commissioner, George Hoffert; postmaster, Val. Wohlstoet, Jr.

During the absence of a full board the organization of the above appointments was deferred until the next regular meeting.

President Root recommended the resigning and reappointing of the village hall, and upon proper motion made and carried the matter was referred to improvement committee.

Roll made application in person for water service pipe to Wash. street. The same was made.

matter was referred to water committee.

Applications for license to deliver beer were read from Woelfersheim & Kellogg, Albert Janowiak and Frank Zimmerman. Said applications were referred to license committee.

Petitions were read from W. S. Carpenter and Bush & Simonson asking drug-glass permits to sell liquors according to the ordinances of the village. On proper motion the applications were granted upon filing of proper bonds.

The bonds of President Root and Clerk White were read and, on motion, approved and accepted.

Trustee Waples moved that hereafter no smoking be allowed during business sessions of the board. Motion carried, all voting aye.

Board met in special session, called by order of President Root, to consider business mentioned in call as follows: For inspection and consideration of acceptance of electric lighting plant, said call being on file in clerk's office.

Mr. C. A. Chapman, consulting engineer, reported on his examination of the electric light plant and favored its acceptance by the village.

The adjourned special meeting was called to order by President Root. Clerk White being absent, Trustee Pearnell was appointed clerk pro tem. Roll call noted present Trustees Bunge, Kuenzel, Pearnell, Waples and Woelfersheim. Absent, Trustee Bush.

Trustee Bunge introduced the following resolution: "Whereas, It appears from the report of the engineer, Charles A. Chapman, that the electric light plant constructed by John T. Burke, under a contract entered into between said John T. Burke and D. G. Graham on the 9th day of December, 1899, has been completed according to said contract and the plans and specifications thereto attached, therefore be it

Resolved, By the board of trustees of the village of Downers Grove, that said plant be, and the same is, hereby accepted by said village as the agent for the Downers Grove Electric Light company, assignee of D. G. Graham: Provided, however, that said John T. Burke shall execute to the Downers Grove Electric Light company and its assigns a bond in the sum of one thousand dollars, conditioned that the said John T. Burke, contractor, shall make good any part of said work, either in material or construction, which shall prove defective within a period of six months from this date, as set forth and described in the specifications made a part of said contract."

Upon motion of Trustees Waples and Kuenzel said resolution was put upon its passage and carried. Those voting aye were Bunge, Waples, Kuenzel, Woelfersheim and Pearnell. Nays, none.

Upon proper motion, made and carried, the board adjourned.

Board met in special meeting called by order of President Root to consider the following business mentioned in call, said call being on file in the clerk's office:

First, to consider resignation of Trustee Bush; second, for consideration of an ordinance regarding purchase of electric light plant; third, for consideration of an ordinance regulating operation of electric light plant.

Meeting was called to order by President Root. Clerk White being absent, Trustee Waples was appointed clerk pro tem.

Roll call noted present Trustees Bunge, Kuenzel, Woelfersheim and Waples. Absent, Trustee Bush and Pearnell. Call for meeting was read and placed on file.

The resignation of Trustee Bush was read. On motion of Trustee Bunge, made and seconded, said resignation was accepted.

President Root reported that the Downers Grove Electric Light company had received bond for \$1,000 from John T. Burke of Omaha, same being properly filed with the company.

An ordinance to provide for the purchase of an electric light plant by the village of Downers Grove was presented and read. Motion of Trustee Bunge, made and seconded, said ordinance was put upon its passage and carried, Trustee Bunge, Kuenzel, Woelfersheim and Waples voting aye. Nays, none. The Downers Grove Electric Light company then transferred the plant, giving a bill of sale for the sum of one dollar. Moved by Trustee Bunge and Woelfersheim that the bill of sale be accepted by the board as set forth by the ordinance for the purchase of said plant. Carried.

An ordinance regulating the operation of the electric light plant was read. It was moved and carried that the ordinance be put upon its passage. Said ordinance was then put upon its passage and carried, Trustee Bunge, Kuenzel, Woelfersheim and Waples voting aye. Nays, none.
