MOB NEGROES IN NEW YORK.

Angry Citizens Attack Blacks on the Public Streets.

100 COLORED MEN BEATEN.

Crowds Seek Vengeance for the Death of an Officer—Race Riot Grows in Violence Until Police Reserves Are Called Out.

A race riot of a most serious character suddenly broke out in the negro district of the west side of New York at 9:30 o'clock Wednesday night. The police reserves were called out, and at midnight 400 officers were patrolling the streets where the trouble was the worst.

From Twenty-sixth street to Fiftieth, between Ninth avenue and Broadway, every negro who showed himself on the sidewalk or on the surface cars were badly beaten. Negroes were dragged off the cars, kicked and stoned. On every corner mobs formed along Eighth avenue for a dozen blocks north and south of Thirty-ninth street, the center point of the trouble.

Wednesday night two white women stopped in front of the house and, looking up at the rooms of the dead policeman's sister, one of them said: "There is where the body of poor Policeman Thorpe is." Just at that moment an intoxicated negro, Spencer Walters, passed the women and heard the remark. Walters was in an ugly mood, and in a loud voice cursed and swore at the whites.

Walters was raising the revolver Thomas J. Hoadly knocked the pistol into the gutter and followed it up by giving the negro a tremendous thrashing. The negro showed more fight when Policeman Kelly ran up, and Kelly beat him on the head with his club until Walters yelled for mercy. Then he took the prisoner to the station house.

Walters was in an ugly mood, and in a loud voice cursed and swore at the whites. He pulled a revolver out of his hip pocket and the two women ran off screaming. Just as Walters was raising the revolver Thomas J. Hoadly knocked the pistol into the gutter and followed it up by giving the negro a tremendous thrashing.

He says he was appointed by lot to perform the deed, but that his courage failed him. His identity has not yet been established, but a dagger and a loaded revolver were found on his person.

She is somewhat recovered from the shock caused by the news of the murder and declares her intention to visit her son. She talks constantly about him, even in her sleep.

Canadian-Alaskan Railway Assured. The Victoria, (B. C.) Times says that the money for MacKenzie and Mann's railway from the great lakes to the Pacific, with a branch to Dawson, has been subscribed in London. The Pacific terminus will be on the northern coast of British Columbia.

Georgia Has Race Riot. Militiamen have been ordered to Liberty county, Georgia, to quell a serious race riot. The negroes are gathering in the woods and two towns have been fired.

The soil of Peru contains the largest number of mineral species—at Puzos, in the north, petroleum and sulphur; silver, lead, copper and coal in the great mining basin of Cerro de Pasco, in central Peru, and phosphate, quicksilver, auriferous grounds and borax at Arequipa, Carabaja, in the south. At the present time the number of mines in exploitation is 2,500, employing 20,000 workmen. The value of ore has increased by more than 50 per cent within the last two years over that in 1898.
