Angry Citizens Attack Blacks or the Public Streets.

COLORED MEN BEATEN

of an Officer-Race Rlot Grows in Violence Until Police Reserves Are Called Out.

A race riot of a most serious character suddenly broke out in the negro district of the west side of New York at 9:30 o'clock Wednesday night. The police reserves were called out, and at midnight 400 officers were patroling the streets where the trouble was the worst. From Twenty-sixth street to Fiftieth, between Ninth avenue and Broadway, every negro who showed himself on the sidewalk or on the surface cars were badly beaten. Negroes were dragged off the cars, kicked and stoned. On every corner mobs formed along Eighth avenue for a dozen blocks north and south of Thirty-ninth street, the center point of the trouble. When a car came along bear ing a negro passenger the crowd at one corner would yell to that at the next. The car would be stopped, the motorman prevented from turning on the current, and in a jiffy the unfortunate colored man would be dragged off, punched, kicked, rolled in the street, and pelted with stones. It is estimated upwards of 100 negroes were thus treated. The trouble started at 9 p. m. on the sidewalk in front of the house at 481 Ninth avenue. A wakc was being held there over the body of Policeman Robert J. Thorpe. Thorpe on Sunday morning last started to arrest a colored woman, May Eno. At Ninth avenue and Forty-first street a young colored man, Arthur Harris, approached the policeman and asked him what he meant by placing the woman under arrest. Before Thorpe could reply Harris pulled a knife and stabbed the policeman three times in the stomach. Thorpe was taken to Roosevelt hospital and died there on Monday. Since the death of Thorpe there has been much ill-feeling between the whites and the blacks in the West Thirty-seventh street precinct Thorpe's body was removed to the home of his sister at 481 Ninth avenue. and there has been much talk among the neighbors about wreaking ven-

stopped in front of the house and, looking up at the rooms of the dead policeman's sister, one of them said: There is where the body of poor Po-Beeman Thorpe is." Just at that moment an intextested negro, Spencer Walters, passed the women and heard the remark. Walters was in an ugly mood, and in a loud voice cursed and swore at the whitea. He pulled a rewoiver put of his hip pocket and the two women ran off screaming. Just as Walters was raising the revolver Thomas J. Healy knocked the pistol into the gutter and followed it up by giving the negro a tremendous thrashing. The negro showed more fight when Policeman Kelly ran up, and Kelly beat him on the head with his club until Walters yelles for mercy. Then he took the prisoner to the station house. Like wildfire the news spread all over that a negro had tried to murder two white women. The white people, already inflamed by the killing of Thorpe, poured out of their houses. of the situation, and mobs walked up and down the streets inhabited by negroes and drove them into their houses, On every street corner for a mile along Eighth average gangs of young roughs gathered. Every negro who passed up or down the street was beaten and






