With the foregoing record and the fact that his books have been printed by a committee establishment, can it be concluded that Mr Bryan has any special claims to the support of men who "eat their bread in the sweat of their face?" Eloquent generalities about the dignity of labor and the oppression of the "laboring classes," are all very well in their way, but candidates for exalted political positions are judged by what they do and not by what they say. It is very important to know a candidate's record on the labor question, especially if he appeals directly to the laboring element for votes, in order to decide whether he is sincere in his professisons. The verdict in Mr. Bryan's case, from the evidence must be a negative one.
