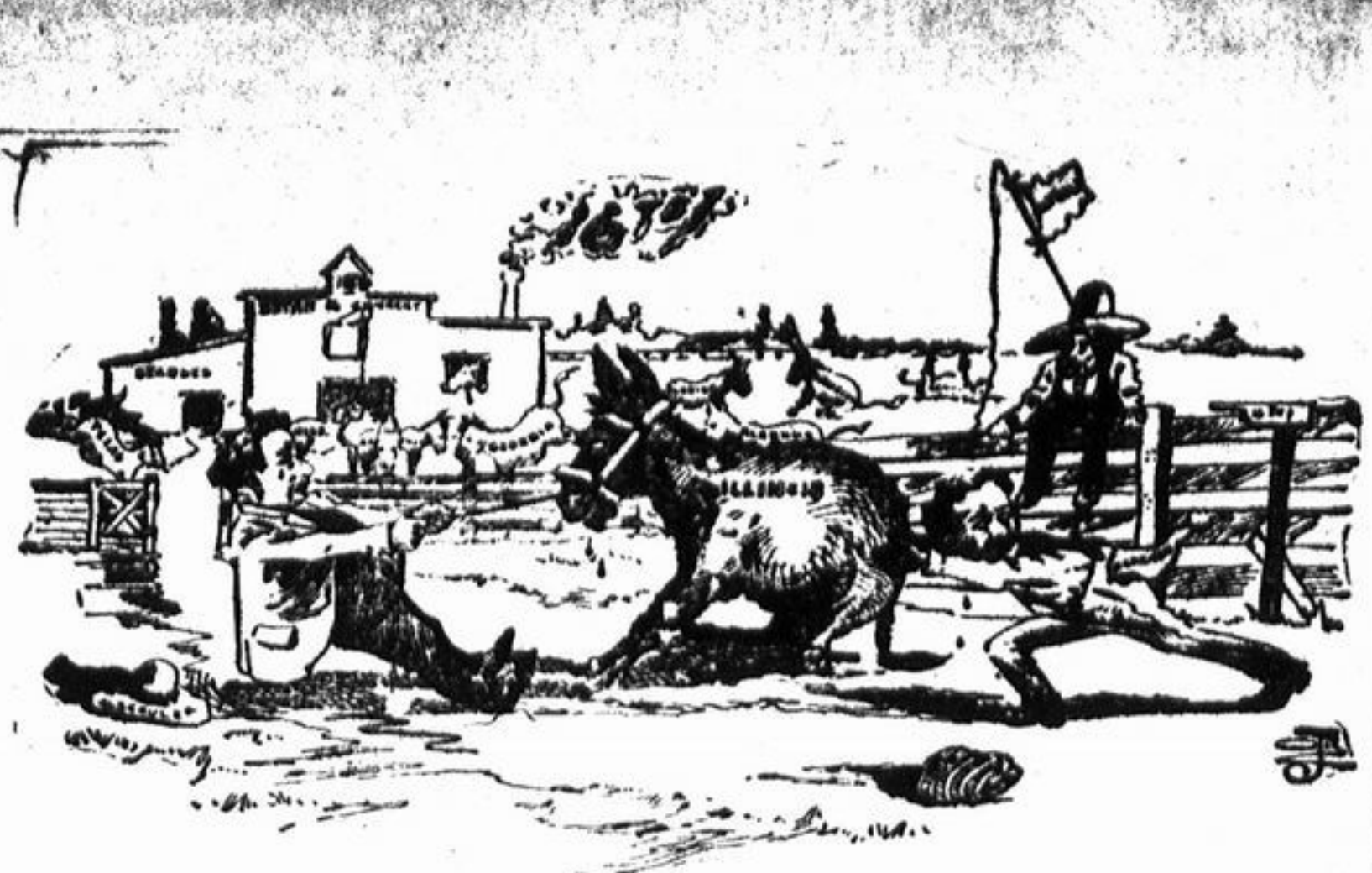

### BRYAN AND UNION LABOR.

His Congressional Record as to Questions Interesting Workingmen.

Inasmuch as appeals are being constantly made to the labor vote by the newspapers and other supporters of Mr. Bryan, it is permissible to examine his congressional record as to questions in which the workingmen were interested. It is not a lengthy record, but sufficient to tell the tale and may be summarized as follows:

1.—When in congress did Mr. Bryan offer, aid or promote any bill to benefit labor? Never.

2.—While representing a Nebraska district in congress did he not ask the governor of Nebraska to call on troops to suppress local labor strikes? Uncontradicted evidence says, "Yes."

3.—What is his labor record on any live labor issue? Nothing.

4.—Did he not junket over the country at a time when striking miners whose cause he had championed in his own profit, were starving and otherwise suffering? Yes.

5.—When the resolution indorsing president Cleveland's action in calling out federal troops to suppress the labor strike was on its passage in congress did Congressman Bryan protest or oppose in any way the passage of the resolution? He sat silent in his seat.

6.—What is his general position on labor? Jaw-smith-mouth labor exclusively.

With the foregoing record and the fact that his books have been printed by a union establishment, can it be concluded that Mr. Bryan has any special claims to the support of men who "eat their bread in the sweat of their face"? Eloquent generalities about the dignity of labor and the oppression of the "laboring classes," are all very well in their way, but candidates for exalted political positions are judged by what they do and not by what they say. It is very important to know a candidate's record on the labor question, especially if he appeals directly to the laboring element for votes, in order to decide whether he is sincere in his professions. The verdict in Mr. Bryan's case, from the evidence must be a negative one.

### A PAGE FROM HISTORY.

#### What Democracy Thought of Lincoln Thirty-Five Years Ago.

The following handbill which was published last week in the Bushnell Record ought to appeal to the patriotism of every American citizen. The Democratic party today is holding the name of Lincoln in reverence. See what it thought of him thirty-five years ago! White men of McDonough! who prize the Constitution of our Fathers, who love the Union formed by their wisdom and compromise; brave men who hate the rebellion of Abraham Lincoln, and are determined to destroy it; noble women, who do not want their husbands and sons dragged to the valley of DEATH by a remorseless Tyrant rally on to this meeting in your strength and numbers.

Today it arouses the ire of a Democrat to tell him that his party opposed the war in '65. He realizes the awfulness of the mistake but it has taken thirty-five years to convince him.
