That early apostle of democracy in Great Britain, William Cobbett, said that the difference between a rule by oligarchs and a government of the people by the people was that the latter was "the gospel of a full belly for the workman, while the former was the gospel of luxury for a few." Nothing truer was ever sald.

Our own Declaration of Independence declares that "We hold these truths to be self-evident; that all men are created equal; that they are endowed by their Creator with certain inalienable rights; that among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of hap-

Now it is certain that hungry men cannot be happy.
